Reflections From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Over the last several months the newly formed *Buildings and Grounds Committee* of the Parish Finance Council has been quite busy doing an analysis of all parish properties. The committee is chaired by Norb Farnaus and working with him are George Gogola, Mike Jackovich, Steve Schorsch and Joe Sterner. All of these men have considerable background in construction and engineering and I am most grateful for their expertise.

In creating this committee I asked that after completing their analysis of the parish infrastructure they put together a two year plan for responding to needs for correcting, maintaining and improving the parish infrastructure (buildings: church, John XXIII Pastoral Center, rectory). Printed in today's bulletin is a copy of their two year plan printed for your study. Over the next several weeks the committee will go into more detail to help all of us, including myself, to better understand what these various capital projects are about and why they need to be done.

I think it important in looking at the report to keep in mind that in general the facilities have been well maintained. However, as with everything, things begin to deteriorate. In maintaining buildings there are two approaches that one can take. One is to wait until something breaks or falls apart (reactive) or develop a maintenance plan that anticipates needs and addresses them before they become critical or urgent.

In this age of *going green* and the need to conserve and protect the environment one becomes conscious that sometimes holding on to items to save money often actually produces the opposite result. Whether one speaks of light bulbs, heating systems, refrigerators, etc., one finds that it is sometimes more cost effective to upgrade rather than hold onto aging items.

Looking at the proposed two year plan, one sees that the projected costs come to \$90,000. If the parish were to complete all of the work on the infrastructure for this fiscal year, one is talking about an expenditure of \$48,600. This would be the amount needed to cover work on the church, pastoral center and rectory, prioritized in that order.

You may recall that Fr. Kevin Spiess introduced the *Blue Envelope* during his tenure as parish administrator. The purpose of the *Blue Envelope* was to raise monies needed for capital improvement projects in maintaining and developing the parish infrastructure. I am very grateful to everyone who contributes on a regular basis using the *Blue Envelope* (Development Fund). The use of such an envelope is common to many parishes.

Experience has taught me well the importance of such a fund. I remember all too well in my last parish how within a period of two months the heating system in two separate buildings failed and had to be replaced. Putting in two new furnaces ran \$40,000. It was winter and we had no options. Thanks to the parish Development Fund, we were able to pay for new furnaces.

In my planned *e-giving* I am going to add \$50 per month to my regular tithe to go to Divine Savior's Development Fund (the *Blue Envelope*). I would ask that you consider also using on a regular basis the *Blue Envelope* along with your usual Sunday offering.

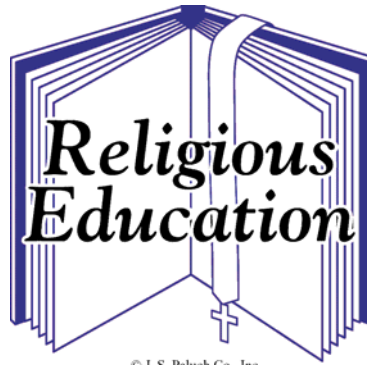

SAN JUAN MARÍA VIANNEY (1786-1859)

4 de agosto

El padre Juan nació en Francia, en una familia campesina pobre y esto le privó de una buena educación formal para luego estudiar en latín. A los 19 años lo despidieron del seminario por no ser apto para los estudios. Un amigo sacerdote intercedió por él ante el obispo para que lo ordenara, ‘no por sus conocimientos, sino por su santidad’. Así fue. Unos años después de ordenado lo enviaron al pueblo de Ars donde había 250 personas alejadas de Dios y de la Iglesia. La gente lo rechazó, pero él los amó profundamente, oró e hizo penitencia por ellos. Poco a poco descubrieron en él a un sacerdote santo y comenzaron a convertirse. Su fama de santidad se extendió en toda Francia y Asís pasó a ser la capital de la fe, pues el gobierno francés tuvo que construir un ferrocarril hasta Ars para responder a los peregrinos. Su fama de confesor fue grande y su devoción también, pues llegó a confesar hasta 15 horas diarias, sabiendo incluso los pecados del penitente antes de que se los confesara.

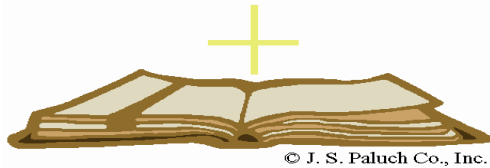

PARISH REGISTRATION
