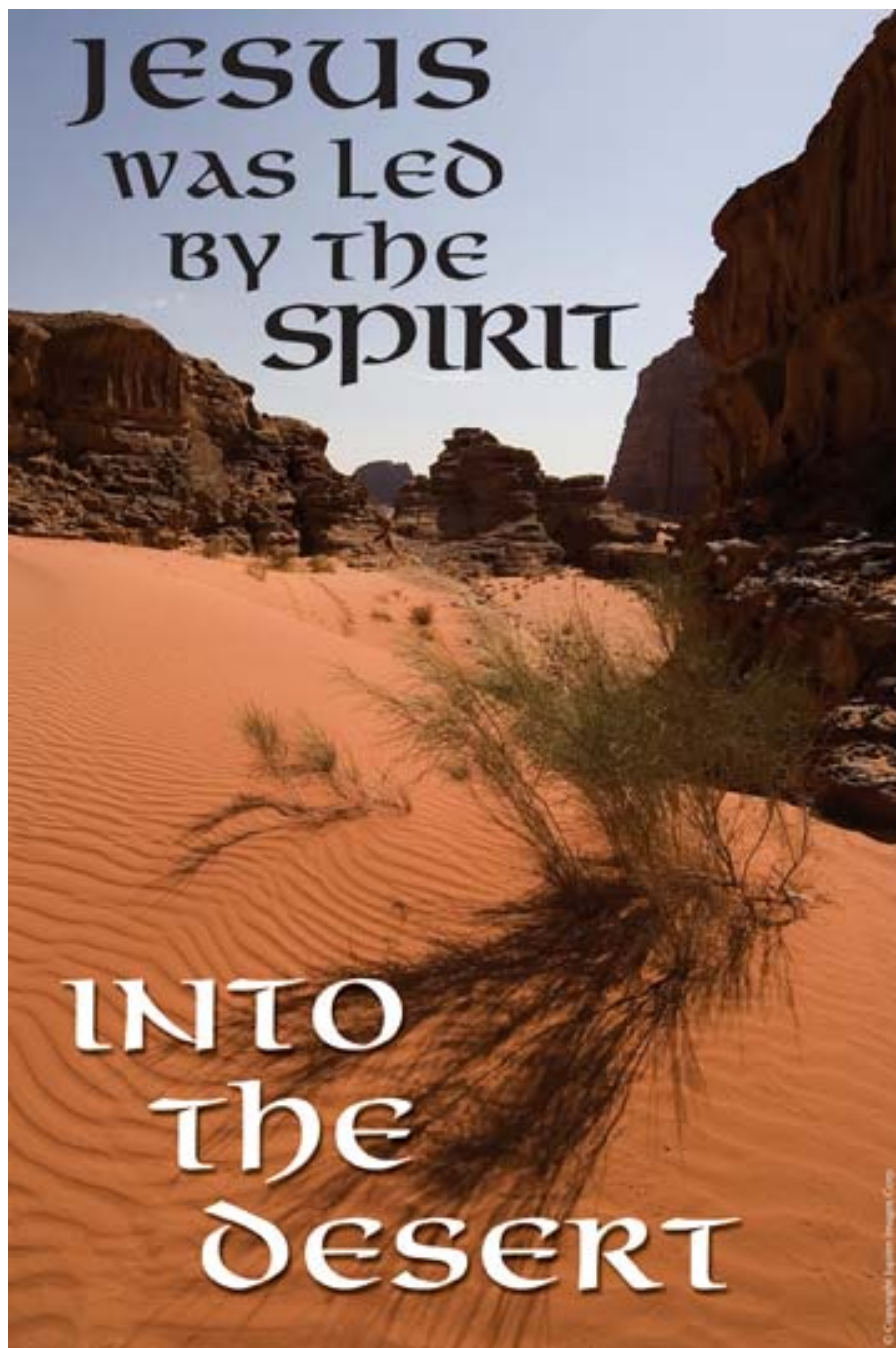

## *Reflections From the Pastor*

*“Behold, now is a very acceptable time;  
behold, now is a day of salvation.”  
- Second Corinthians 6:2*

This week begins the holy season of Lent – a special time for all Catholics. During the forty days Catholics prepare themselves to be washed anew in the waters of Baptism. The preparation calls one to journey with Christ to Calvary and beyond. In some ways Lent could be considered a pilgrimage.

An ancient custom of Rome dating from the 4<sup>th</sup> century is to make a pilgrimage from one church to another each day of Lent. Because Lent was a special time for the faithful of Rome to gather with their bishop, the Bishop of Rome, at St. John Lateran, owing to the crowds, Pope Gregory the Great began the practice of going from the cathedral church to different churches throughout this holy season. The church visited by the pope became known as the *Station Churches*. The Bishop of Rome with the clergy of Lateran and other dignitaries would process each day to one of these *Station Churches*. After the time of the Avignon Papacy, the practice of visiting the Lenten *Station Churches* fell into disuse until the last century.

Four years ago, I had the opportunity to enjoy a sabbatical in Rome during the time of Lent and Holy Week. Needless to say, it was, for me, an extended retreat as well as an opportunity to come to a deeper understanding of the richness of both Lent and Easter. One of the things that I remember was Ash Wednesday, getting up with others at the North American College at about 5:30 a.m. to walk to St. Sabina Church for the 7:00 a.m. Mass. It was the first day of a 40-day pilgrimage, walking each day to a different *Station Church*. It was a cold and dreary morning -- in fact, downright bone-chilling as we pilgrimaged along the Tiber River and crossed over to St. Sabina's Church. This is the church that the Pope goes to on Ash Wednesday to distribute ashes. I still remember how cold it was in the church, especially in view of the dampness of the early morning. Sitting on marble, no matter how many layers of clothes you have on, the dampness begins to get to your bones.

As we walked along the Tiber, groups of seminarians walking at different paces, could be found praying the rosary and singing. I thought to myself what a beautiful thing to do during Lent, journeying from one church to another and coming to a deeper sense that the church is something larger than myself. In fact, as one walks along with others praying and singing, one gets the sense of what it truly means to be a praying church. I still remember on Holy Thursday after dinner leaving the North American College at about 8:00 in the evening and walking around Rome visiting as many churches as I could until about 11:30 p.m. One thing that impressed me as I went from church to church was the number of young adults one found at prayer, or walking like myself from one church to another.

One of the churches I visited was Santa Maria Trastevere located in a very poor neighborhood of Rome. It is the home church of a lay movement called Sant' Egidio. One of the things that impressed me was that on Holy Thursday in the church, they would set up tables to feed the poor and the homeless. What a wonderful sense of Eucharist and church, inviting the poor as their guest and preparing for them a sumptuous meal. [To be continued next week.]

## Updates from our Pastor



### Just a note about the washing the feet on Holy Thursday

If one recalls in the Gospel of John, Jesus, after the washing the feet of Peter, says to all who are gathered, “*As my disciples, you must be washers of feet.*” I always remember my thoughts when viewing on TV the body of Mother Teresa of Calcutta lying on her funeral pall. What caught my attention were her bare feet that bore the signs of wear and tear in service of the poor and of the Lord. I thought how appropriate that these bare feet that had walked so many places should be visible in death.

Each Holy Thursday, it is the practice of the church to wash the feet of 12 apostles. But I fear too often this becomes simply a ritual and not much more. This year I would like all of us to consider participating in the washing of feet:

In the spirit of Jesus’ words, “Be washers of feet.”

To consider participating in the washing of the feet at the celebration of the Lord’s Supper on Holy Thursday. In fact, a wonderful scene of the Gospel to meditate on in this time of Lent would be the Last Supper as it appears in John’s Gospel, concentrating on the relationship of the washing of feet to the Eucharist.

Also, I want to remind you that there will be Stations of the Cross beginning Friday, February 26 at 1:00 PM and 7:00 PM in English, and 8:00 PM in Spanish.

**SAN POLICARPO (c. 60-155)****23 de febrero**

San Policarpo fue discípulo del apóstol Juan y conoció a Jesús por medio de él. Fue el mismo Juan quien lo consagró obispo de Esmirna (Turquía). Ahí predicó valientemente la fe y dirigió a su comunidad en tiempos de persecución, pues se les culpó de que “traían mala suerte” a la ciudad por adorar a Jesús y no a los dioses romanos. Dado que era el líder de la comunidad fue apresado y llevado ante las multitudes reunidas en la arena pública quienes pedían su muerte. Una vez ante la gente y el gobernador, éste le pidió que hablara en contra de Jesús, prometiéndole la libertad. Policarpo respondió: “Ochenta y seis años he servido al Señor Jesús y él no ha hecho nada malo. ¿Cómo crees que voy a blasfemar contra mi Señor y redentor? Soy cristiano”. Fue sentenciado a ser devorado por los leones, pero estos se apartaron de él. Posteriormente, el gobernador ordenó que se le quemara vivo, pero el fuego no le hizo daño. Lleno de furia ordenó que lo degollaran y mandó que su cuerpo fuera quemado.

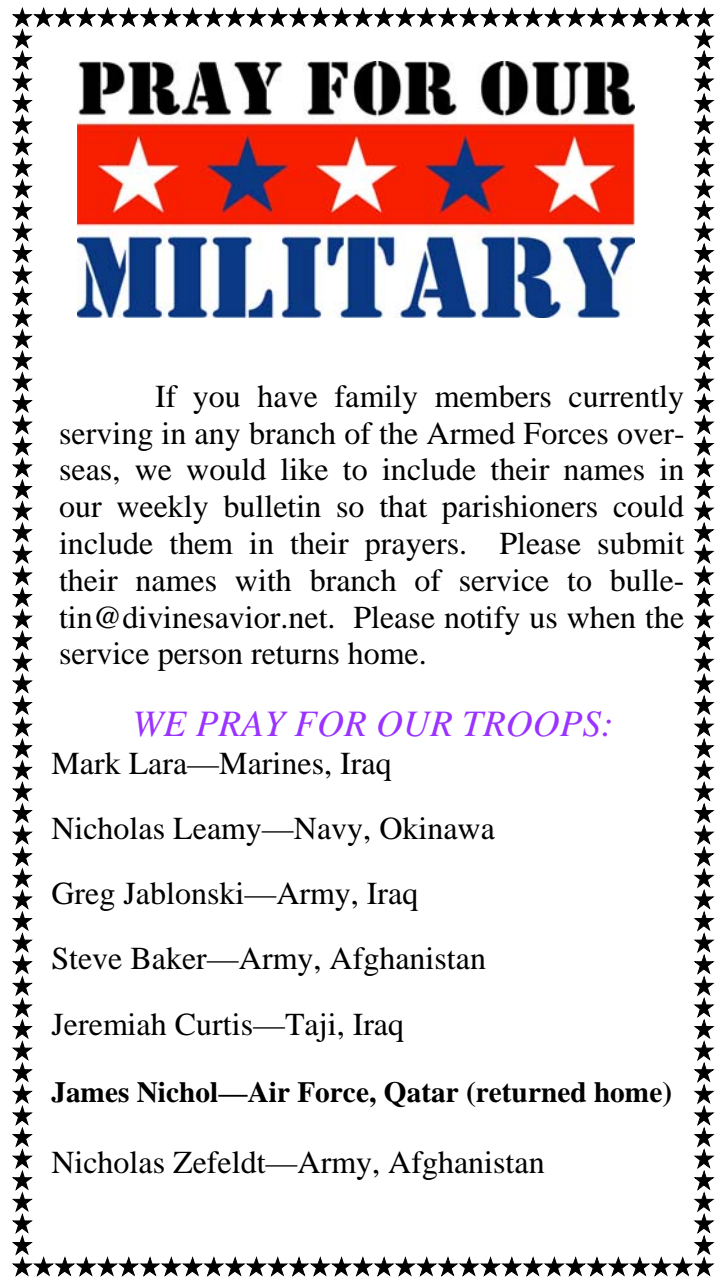

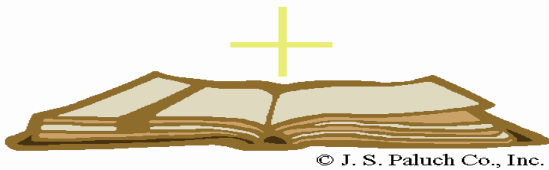
