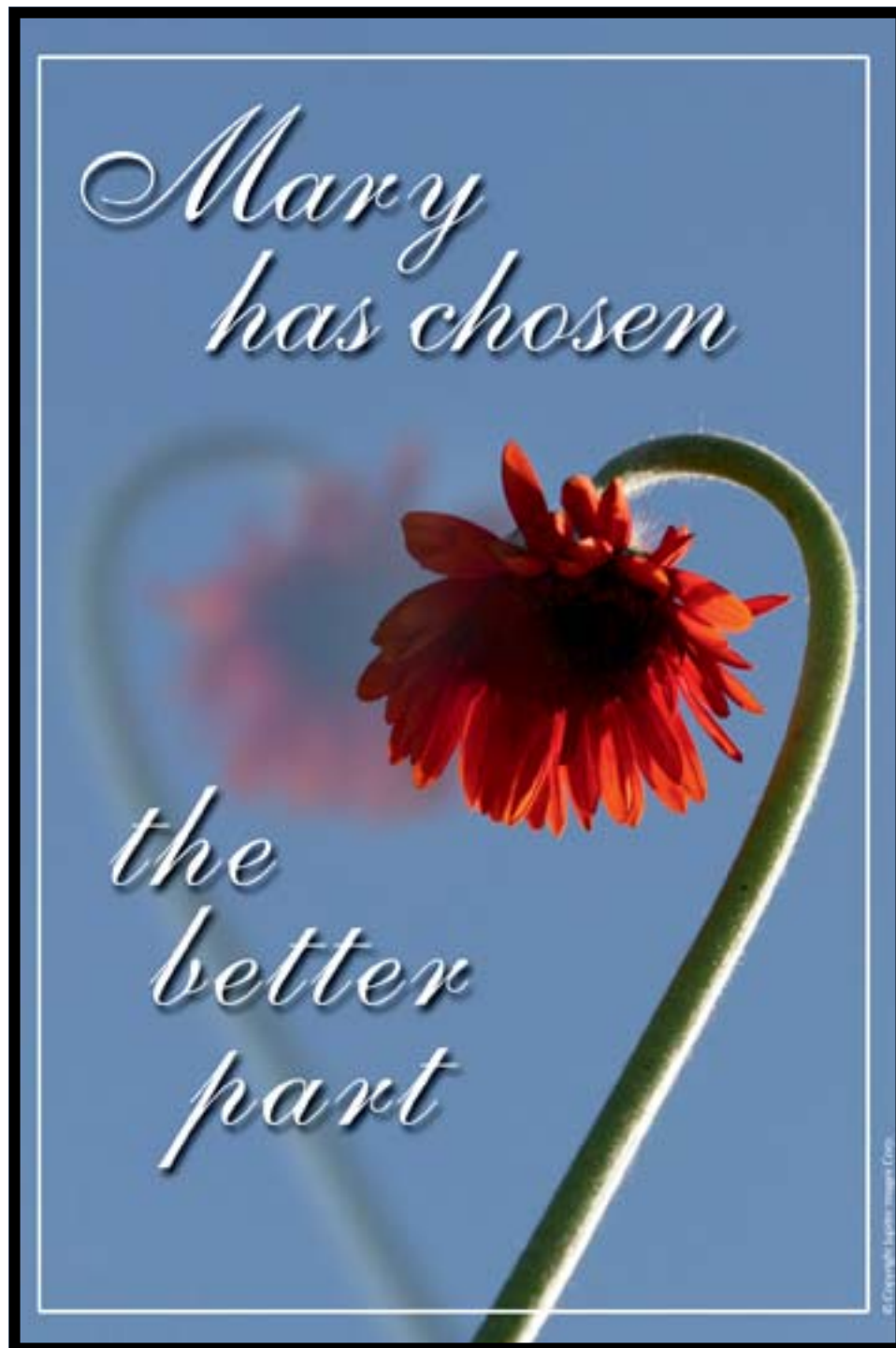
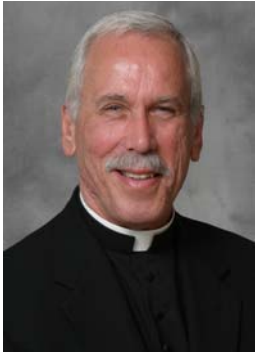

## *Reflections From the Pastor*

*“Do this in memory of Me.”  
- Jesus of Nazareth*

How often I have said those words! How often we have prayed those words! But what do the words mean? Especially to what does the word *this* refer? What is the *antecedent*? To some this may seem trivial or inconsequential, but the fact is the answer has a great deal to do with the understanding of what Jesus intended in giving us the Eucharist. Language is important and the understanding of language has much to do with our perception of reality.

For Catholics and many other Christians there are three languages of particular importance in our self-understanding. Two of those languages are biblical – Hebrew and Greek. The third is both biblical and liturgical - Latin.

The Roman poet, Lucretius, in his philosophical poem, *De Rerum Natura*, laments the fact that Latin is a poor language for expressing philosophical concepts. Indeed, reading St. Thomas Aquinas, one clearly sees the linguistic contortions Aquinas enters into in expressing Aristotelian concepts. A quick study of Latin as opposed to Greek reveals Latin to be the language of lawyers and Greek that of philosophers.

Hebrew offers a completely different perspective. While Greek and Latin are Indo-European languages and both are inflected languages, Hebrew comes from a different family of language, namely Semitic. I remember while studying Hebrew in the seminary having two particular challenges. The first was learning to read and write going from right to left. I needed to retrain my eye as well as my hand to work in a different way. The second challenge was dealing with the fact that in Hebrew one does not write the vowels. This seems to create, at least in the beginning, a kind of guessing game.

In my education I have studied Latin, Greek, French, German, Spanish, and Hebrew. Although with time much of what was learned has faded from memory, what has not is an appreciation for the importance of the study of language. Thomas Jefferson, in establishing the University of Virginia, organized the dining halls according to language. While in his time the language for university curriculum was Latin, students would need to learn other languages as well to be considered well educated. Hence the course of studies one would move from one place to another requiring one to go from French to German to Italian, etc.

Returning to the Liturgy of the Roman Rite of the Church, as we prepare for the new *Roman Missal*, there are two points one needs to bear in mind. First, the official language of the Roman Rite of the Catholic Church to which we belong is Latin. Because of this, the translating of liturgical texts begins with the official Latin text. Secondly, while the Mass texts eventually evolved into the vernacular, this was not the original intention of the Council Fathers of Vatican II. While there was discussion of the use of the vernacular, what was envisioned is certain parts, such as the Scripture readings, would be in the vernacular but others, such as the Eucharistic prayers, would remain in Latin.



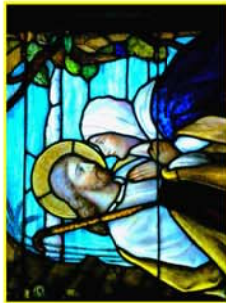

Nos preguntamos si el pasaje del Evangelio según san Lucas sería diferente si María, y no Marta, hubiera sido la que se quejó a Jesús; si María hubiera dicho: “¡Señor, mírala! Aquí estás tú compartiendo tu sabiduría y lo único que le preocupa a ella es la cena”. Puede que Jesús hubiera notado, como lo hace san Lucas, que Marta estaba recargada con mucho trabajo de servicio. Más tarde en sus escritos, este mismo evangelista describirá en los Hechos cómo en las primeras comunidades se designó a personas cuyo ministerio era servir las mesas.

Como persona plenamente humana, Jesús sabía que había necesidades humanas que atender. No lo niega, ni regaña a Marta por su trabajo de servir. La corrige por estar inquieta y preocupada. ¿Cómo puede Marta, o cualquiera de nosotros, estar inquietos o preocupados sobre el servicio que se necesita hacer cuando lo hacemos dentro del contexto de la voluntad y sabiduría del Señor? La Iglesia ha hecho más que cualquier otra institución llevando la pesada carga de servir a los enfermos, a los que necesitan educación, a los que sufren; ha sido “Marta” para incontables pequeñitos que Cristo dijo son su misma presencia. Sin embargo, la Iglesia ha llevado la carga del servicio desde la postura de María: a los pies del Señor, escuchando y siendo guiados por su palabra.

Brígida fue una persona bendecida por Dios, no sólo porque desde muy pequeña abrigó en su ser el deseo de ser santa, sino porque en su proceso de santidad Dios le concedió tener visiones de la Pasión de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo. En estas experiencias místicas recibió mensajes de Nuestro Señor, que después transmitió a los líderes de la Iglesia. También fue esposa y madre, pues aunque se casó muy joven, supo inculcar en sus hijos el amor a la santidad, tanto así que una hija suya, Catalina de Suecia, es venerada como santa. Junto con su esposo Ulf, fueron parte de la corte durante dos años, de hecho, ella podía llegar a ser la reina, pero no se interesó por los puestos o por la vida cómoda, antes bien, vistió con sencillez y motivó a los reyes de Suecia a que fueran santos. Vivió la caridad de una manera profunda con los pobres y enfermos, pues una vez que enviudó, fundó la Orden Religiosa del Santísimo Redentor, dedicándose de entero a la caridad con los necesitados.

## DON'T BE ANXIOUS

One can wonder how Luke's Gospel passage today might have been different if Mary, not Martha, had been the one to complain to Jesus, if Mary had said "Lord, look at her! Here you are sharing your wisdom and all she can think about is supper." Jesus may have noted, as Luke does, that Martha was burdened with much serving. Later in his writings, this same evangelist will describe in Acts how the early community set aside people whose ministry it is to see to the serving at table.

As a fully human person, Jesus knew the human needs that had to be tended. He doesn't deny this, nor does he chastise Martha for her working in service. He chides her for being anxious and worried. How can Martha—or any of us—be anxious or worried about the serving that needs to be done when we do it in the context of the Lord's will and wisdom? The Church has done more than any other institution to bear the heavy burdens of serving the ill, the uneducated, the suffering; has been "Martha" to countless of the little ones whom Christ told us were his very presence. But the Church has borne the burdens of service from the position of Mary: at the feet of the Lord, listening to and being guided by his word.

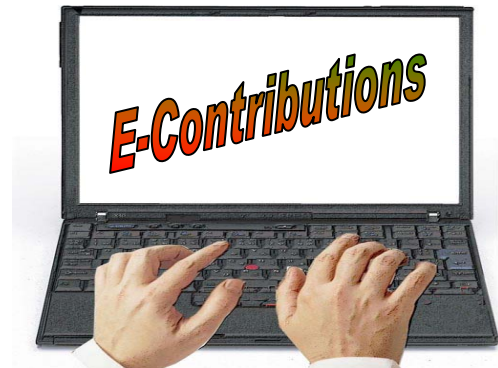

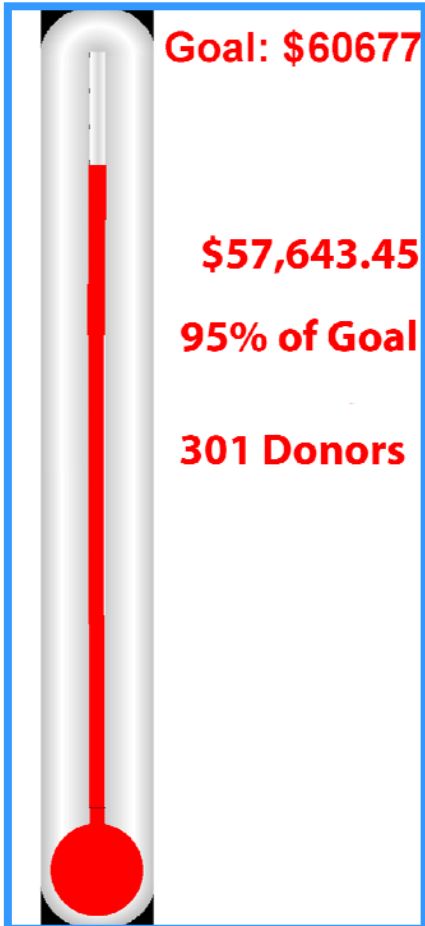
