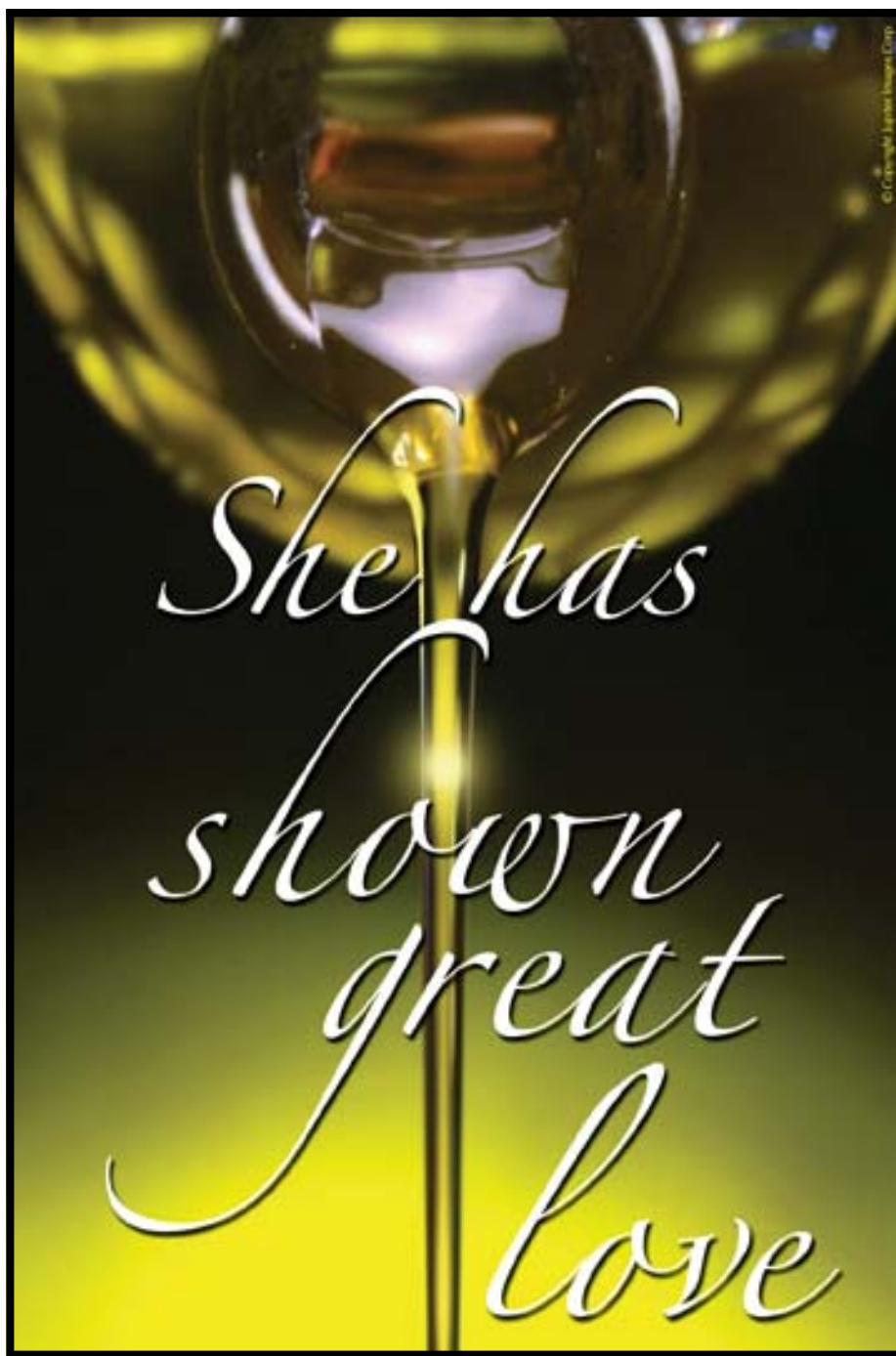

Reflections From the Pastor

One Bread, One Body, One Lord of All!

As you read this article, know that I am with you in a very special and unique way. Celebrating Eucharist in Sucre, Bolivia, with a group of college students from the Diocese of Joliet, I will not only be praying with them, but with the Church universal. You will be present at my Mass as I will be present at yours.

During this diocesan year of the Eucharist in preparation for the publication of the new Roman Missal to be used at Mass, there will be an opportunity to reflect on the Mass and what Jesus intended by the gift of the Eucharist. The Church teaches that it is at the moment when we gather for Eucharist that we are truly Church. And because of this all that we do as Church should either flow to or from what is celebrated at the Eucharistic Table.

I sometimes think that many Catholics have lost a sense of what is done at the Table of the Eucharist and by whom, as well who it is that gathers at the Table. First and foremost, it is Christ, the High Priest, who leads us in this prayer to the Father. The celebrant of the Mass who presides acts *in persona Christi* (in the person of Christ). As a presider this is very humbling. One is reminded that he is not center stage, but rather it is Christ who truly presides.

It is not only important that the presider is mindful of this, but also the assembly gathered for Eucharist. I sometimes feel uncomfortable when someone says I like when Father So and So says Mass. The point is that the Mass is not about Fr. So and So.

As I mentioned at the beginning of the article, though I will be separated by miles celebrating Mass in Sucre, you will be present as I will be present at the Eucharist at Divine Savior. This one might say is the cosmic dimension of the Mass. As the Eucharistic prayer clearly reflects the Church is much more than an institution. The Church transcends both space and time. For not only the Church on earth (*church militant*), but the Church in heaven (*church triumphant*) and the Church in purgatory (*church suffering*) gather with Christ, the High Priest, to offer a sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to the Father in and through the Holy Spirit. How often one hears the phrase “*in union with the whole Church*”!

In speaking of the mystical dimension of the Eucharistic celebration, one needs to attend to the role of the Holy Spirit. Close attention to the Eucharistic prayer brings out the role of the Holy Spirit as *Sanctifier* (“make holy these gifts”) but also as *Unifier* (“make us one in the sharing of the Body and Blood of Christ”). Indeed, it is the Holy Spirit who makes possible the *communion* we experience with one another in Christ.

Attending to all of this, one sees the *Trinitarian structure* of the Mass. The celebration of the Mass is, first and foremost, a divine activity – God being God. Secondly, one begins to appreciate the awesome privilege one has to participate and share in this *Divine Banquet*. Through Baptism one shares in the *Royal Priesthood of Jesus, the Christ* and at Eucharist, as a member of this priesthood, one offers with Christ through and in the Holy Spirit the eternal and life giving sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving.

***Un Pan, Un cuerpo,
Un Dios para Todos!***

En cuanto usted lea este artículo, sepa que estoy con usted en una manera muy especial y extraordinaria. Celebrando la Eucaristía en Sucre, Bolivia, con un grupo de estudiantes de colegio de la Diócesis de Joliet, y yo no sólo oraré con ellos, pero con la Iglesia universal. Ustedes estarán presentes en mi Misa así como yo estaré presente en la suya.

Durante este año diocesano de la Eucaristía en la preparación para la publicación del nuevo Misal romano para ser utilizado en Misas, habrá una oportunidad de reflejar en la Misa y sobre lo que Jesús quería sobre el regalo de la Eucaristía. La Iglesia enseña que es realmente cuando nos reunimos para la Eucaristía que somos sinceramente uno en la Iglesia. Y a causa de esto, nosotros debemos fluir con la Iglesia hacia o desde lo que es celebrado en la mesa de la Eucaristía.

Yo pienso a veces que muchos católicos han perdido el sentido de lo que se hace en la Mesa de la Eucaristía y por quien, y sobre que es lo que se reúne en la Mesa. Antes que nada, es Cristo, el Sumo Sacerdote, que nos dirige en esta oración a nuestro Padre. El celebrante de la Misa que preside actos en el personaje Christi (en la persona de Cristo). Como el que preside con gran humildad. Uno es recordado que uno, el que preside, no es el centro del escenario, sino es Cristo el que preside en el.

No solo es importante que el que preside sea cuidadoso con esto, pero también la asamblea que se reúne en la Eucaristía. Yo algunas veces me siento incomodo al escuchar a algunas personas que comentan, "a mi me gusta el padre de esta misa, etc., y el punto no es sobre el padre que da la misa sino la Misa misma.

Como he mencionado en al principio de este articulo, yo estaré separado por muchas millas celebrando la misa en Sucre y ustedes estaran presentes conmigo así como yo estare presente en la Eucaristía del Divine Savior. En esto, tal vez uno diría que es la dimensión cosmica de la Misa. Asi como la oracion Eucarística claramente que refleja a la Iglesia como mucho mas que una institucion. La Iglesia es ambos, espacio y tiempo. Por lo que no solo la Iglesia en el mundo (Iglesia Militante), pero la Iglesia en el cielo (*Iglesia Triunfante*) y la Iglesia en el purgatorio (*Iglesia del sufrimiento*) reunida en Cristo, el Sumo Sacerdote, para ofrecer el sacrificio como un regalo y agradecimiento al Padre en y dentro del Espiritu Santo. Que tan frecuentemente uno escucha la frase "*en unión con toda la Iglesia*"!

A hablar de la dimensión mística de la celebración eucarística, uno debe ocuparse sobre el papel del Espíritu Santo. La atención cercana a la oración eucarística saca el rol del Espíritu Santo como Santifico ("haga santos estos regalos") pero también como Unificador ("háganos uno en el compartir el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo"). Verdaderamente, es el Espíritu Santo que hace posible la comunión que experimentamos el uno al otro en Cristo.

Ocupándose de todo esto, uno ve la estructura Trinitaria de la Misa. La celebración de la Misa es, antes que nada, una actividad divina – Dios siendo Dios. En segundo lugar, uno comienza a apreciar el privilegio impresionante que uno tiene al participar y compartir el Banquete Divino. En el Bautismo, uno comparte en el Sacerdocio Real de Jesús, el Cristo y en la Eucaristía, como un miembro de este sacerdocio, uno ofrece con Cristo por y en el Espíritu Santo la vida eterna al sacrificarse en la alabanza y agradecimiento.

ONE STEP AT A TIME

I admit, I am a hoarder (I prefer the word “saver”) of stories. Some stories I carry within, stories of people I have met who have mentored me on my life journey; others are stories from articles or books I have read. Yes, I am a “saver” of stories.

Several years ago, there was a front page article that appeared in the Tribune's Q section (Qualities of Life) titled "Has the race to faith passed you by?" Within the article itself, there were testimonials from several who experienced conversion. One African American woman spoke of her journey this way:

“It takes God to take a black woman, raised under Jim Crow, and give me a new heart and love for my fellow man and not look at skin color. And that has been a gradual process.”

God had changed her, says this woman, who could still recall a skating rink in her Tennessee hometown, choosing to close forever in the early ‘60’s rather than allow black children to skate alongside whites. The author of this article said that unlike Saul being struck blind on the road to Damascus in the New Testament, the most common emerging trend has been spiritual formation -- "a fancy way of saying that people grow in their faith through stages".

In today’s Gospel reading, Jesus responded to Simon, a proud Pharisee, who thinks he knows the heart of the woman who wipes the feet of Jesus with her tears. Then Jesus tells a story (Jesus, the great story-teller) of two people in debt to a certain creditor. One owes twice as much as the other, and the creditor forgave both debtors. “Which will love him more?” Jesus asks Simon, and Simon replies “The one I suppose whose larger debt was forgiven”. Jesus responds, “You have judged rightly”.

Jesus brought out the best in Simon and the people around him by pulling (not pushing) them along. He knew we grow in faith. . . ONE STEP AT A TIME.
