Diocese of Joliet Official Biography for Patron Saint of the Year of the Eucharist June: Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati (1901-1925)



"...I urge you with all the strength of my soul to approach the Eucharistic Table as often as possible. Feed on this Bread of the Angels from which you will draw the strength to fight inner struggles, the struggles against passions and against all adversities, because Jesus Christ has promised to those who feed themselves with the most Holy Eucharist, eternal life and the necessary graces to obtain it.

And when you become totally consumed by this Eucharistic Fire, then you will be able to thank with greater awareness the Lord God who has called you to be part of his flock and you will enjoy that peace which those who are happy according to the world have never tasted. Because true happiness, young people, does not consist in the pleasures of the world and in earthly things, but in peace of conscience which we can have only if we are pure in heart and in mind." (Frassati, Letter to the "Catholic Youth" of Pollone, July 29, 1923)

Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati is a saint for the modern world and especially for the youth of the new millennium. He was born on Holy Saturday, April 6, 1901 in Turin, Italy. Pier Giorgio was a model of virtue, a "man of the beatitudes," as Pope John Paul II called him at the saint's beatification ceremony in Rome on May 20, 1990. He was described by friends as "an explosion of joy." His sister, Luciana, says of her brother in her biography of him, "He represented the finest in Christian youth: pure, happy, enthusiastic about everything that is good and beautiful." Pier Giorgio admired the beauty of the arts and opera, and he prayed daily, offering, among other prayers, a daily rosary on his knees by his bedside. Often Pier Giorgio's agnostic father would find him asleep in this position.

"He gave his whole self, both in prayer and in action, in service to Christ," Luciana Frassati writes. After Pier Giorgio began to attend Jesuit school as a boy, he received a rare permission in those days to take communion daily. For Frassati, Christ was the answer. Therefore, all of his action was oriented toward Christ and began first in contemplation of Him: "Sometimes he passed whole nights in Eucharistic adoration." Motivated by the Eucharist to put his faith into action, Pier Giorgio actively participated in various Catholic social movements and began to ardently serve the needy and the poor as a third order Dominican in 1922 at the age of 21.

Pier Giorgio Frassati died in Turin at the age of 24. In his short life he accomplished more acts of love than most people accomplish in a lifetime. His parents were amazed at their son's funeral as thousands lined the streets of Turin to show their love and gratitude to such a selfless soul. Pier Giorgio responded to God's call to reach out to the poor, the outcast, and the forgotten, to bring God's love and light to the world. The fire of his zeal was enkindled by the fire of the Eucharist. Christ gave Blessed Pier Giorgio the ears to hear and eyes to see what many of us fail to comprehend, which is the presence of God, especially in the Eucharist and one another.

Pier Giorgio Frassati's mortal remains were found incorrupt in 1981. Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati's feast day is July 4, the anniversary of his death.

Corporal work of Mercy: To feed the hungry.

Diócesis de Joliet Biografía oficial de **Patrono de la Año de la Eucaristía** **Junio: Beato Pier Giorgio Frassati** (1901-1925)



“...Le insisto con toda la fuerza de mi alma a acercarse a la mesa eucarística tan a menudo como sea posible. Aliméntense de este pan de los Ángeles de donde tomarás la fuerza para luchar contra luchas interiores, las luchas contra pasiones y contra las adversidades, porque Jesucristo ha prometido a aquellos que se alimentan con la Sagrada Eucaristía, la vida eterna y las gracias necesarias para obtenerlos.

Y cuando usted se consume completamente por este fuego eucarístico, entonces usted podrá dar las gracias con mayor conciencia al Señor Dios que le ha llamado a ser parte de su rebaño y disfrutará de esa paz que aquellos que están contentos de acuerdo con el mundo nunca han probado. Porque felicidad verdadera, jóvenes, no consiste en los placeres del mundo y en las cosas terrenales, pero en paz de conciencia que podemos tener sólo si somos puros en el corazón y en la mente.” (Frassati, Carta a los “Jóvenes Católicos” de Pollone, Julio 29, 1923)

Beato Pier Giorgio Frassati es un santo para el mundo moderno y especialmente para los jóvenes del nuevo milenio. Nació en Sábado Santo, 6 de Abril, 1901 en Torino, Italia. Pier Giorgio era un modelo de virtud, “un hombre de los Actitudes,” como el Papa Juan Pablo II lo llamó en la ceremonia de beatificación de los Santos en Roma el 20 de Mayo de 1990. Fue definido por amigos como “una explosión de alegría.” Su hermana, Luciana, dice de su hermano en su biografía del él, “Representaba lo mejor en la juventud cristiana: puro, feliz, entusiástico acerca de todo lo que es bueno y hermoso.” Pier Giorgio admiró la belleza del arte y la ópera, y oró diariamente, ofreciendo, entre otras oraciones, un rosario diariamente de rodillas al lado de su cama. A menudo el padre agnóstico de Pier Giorgio lo encontraba dormido en esta posición.

Luciana Frassati escribe que “El entregaba todo su ser, ambos en oración y en acción, al servicio de Cristo,” Después, Pier Giorgio comenzó a asistir a la escuela Jesuita como un niño, recibió un permiso raro en aquellos días para tomar comunión diariamente. Para Frassati, Cristo era la respuesta. Por lo tanto, todas sus acciones estaba orientada hacia Cristo y empezó primero en la contemplación de él: “A veces pasó noches enteras en la adoración eucarística.” Motivado por la eucaristía para poner su fe en acción, Pier Giorgio participó activamente en varios movimientos sociales católicos y comenzó a ayudar ardentemente a los necesitados y a los pobres como una tercera orden Dominicano en 1922 a la edad de 21 años.

Pier Giorgio Frassati murió en Torino a la edad de 24 años. En su vida corta logró más actos de amor que la mayoría de la gente logra en la vida. Sus padres se sorprendieron en el funeral de su hijo como miles alinearon en las calles de Torino para mostrar su amor y gratitud a un alma tal desinteresado. Pier Giorgio respondió a la llamada de Dios para ayudar a los pobres, los marginados, y los olvidados, a llevar el amor de Dios y la luz del mundo. El fuego de su celo fue encendido por el fuego de la eucaristía. Cristo dio al Beato Pier Giorgio los oídos para escuchar y los ojos para ver lo que muchos de nosotros nos falta comprender, que es la presencia de Dios, especialmente en la eucaristía y en uno al otro.

Los restos mortales de Pier Giorgio Frassati se encontraron incorruptos en 1981. El día de fiesta del Beato Pier Giorgio Frassati es el 4 de Julio, el aniversario de su muerte.

FATHERS DAY

Fathers come in all sizes, shapes and descriptions, some fathers are short and others are tall, some are chubby and others are skinny. The most celebrated father is one we know very little about, we don't know if he was tall or if he was skinny, we don't know how old he was. This mysterious father was the husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary and, the earthly father of our Lord JESUS.

Devotions to St. Joseph was unknown in the church for many centuries as it was feared that too much emphasis on his position as earthly father may make him appear as the natural father of JESUS. Pope Pius IX declared St. Joseph patron of the Church in 1870. In 1937 Pope Pius XI declared St. Joseph the patron of the Churches campaign against communism. 1955 Pope Pius XII proclaimed the feast of St. Joseph the worker to replace the solemnity of St. Joseph.

Joseph was espoused to Mary, when he found that she was pregnant he was going to divorce her. An angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph and told him that it was through the Holy Spirit that she had conceived. Joseph took Mary into his home as his wife (Matthew 1:18-24). Again an angel appeared to Joseph and warned him that Herod was going to destroy JESUS. Joseph took Jesus and Mary his mother and fled to Egypt (Matthew 2:13-14). Joseph, Mary and JESUS stayed in Egypt until an angel appeared to Joseph again and told him it was safe to return to Israel. Three times Joseph did as the angel instructed.

We know that Joseph was a carpenter and his skills would have been sought by his community. It was these skills that Joseph used to provide food, shelter and love, as most fathers do today.

It is fitting that St. Joseph is regarded as the model for all fathers.
