## *Reflections From the Pastor*

*“Come back to me with all your heart.  
Don’t let fear keep us apart.”  
- Hosea*

These words of the Lord to the prophet Hosea resonate often within my heart. How much God wants and desires to dwell with me. Yet often it is fear that truly keeps me from the Lord. The fear that if I am truly honest with the Lord, He may not love me. It is unfortunate how much the experience of human love tends to color my relationship to God.

During Lent the Lord calls us in a special way. He calls us to experience a change of heart, to take the risk of trusting in His Word to us. However, to hear His voice I need to quiet myself, to dare to enter the silence of my being and to allow God through His holy Word to speak to me.

As a child, I learned that sin was an offense against God. It is a choice to turn away from the Lord and ignore His presence in my life. Keeping this in mind, I have come to realize that sin is about relationship – relationship to God, to others and to self. It is about the choice I make regarding those relationships.

It is interesting if I go back to the Adam and Eve story. The story of Adam’s sin is a story about choice. Unfortunately, the choice he and Eve make causes them to feel shame. Aware of the consequence of that choice, they are filled with shame. They feel a need to hide not only from God but from each other as well as self. The good news in the story is that God seeks them out and calls them from their hiding place, from their shame. While there are consequences to their decision, God does not withdraw His love nor does He turn away from them.

What saddens me as a priest is how many of us, much like Adam and Eve, try to hide from God in our shame. The shame does not come from God but from ourselves and our fear of taking the risk of allowing God to be God. I find we often play games with ourself, trying to minimize the need to come clean with God. Many of us, including myself, are fairly good at playing games, justifying why I don’t need to go to confession. But I’ve discovered happily that the con game doesn’t work with God.

What has helped greatly in changing my attitude toward the Sacrament of Penance has been learning to pray with Scripture (*lectio divina*). Sitting quietly and allowing God to tell me His story has helped me to understand the depth of His love for me. The very word *redemption* signals not only His love for me but more importantly that God sees in me something beautiful and good, something worth redeeming. This is why I have come to value praying with Scripture as the way to prepare for the sacrament of Penance.

This coming week, Thursday, March 25, the parish will celebrate (and I mean *celebrate!*) the sacrament of Reconciliation. I invite everyone to join us either at 1:00 p.m. or 7:00 p.m. for this wonderful celebration of God’s mercy and forgiveness. See you there!

“Vengan a mi con todo su corazón.  
No permitan que el temor nos aparte.”  
- Hosea

Estas palabras de nuestro Señor al profeta Hosea resuenan a menudo dentro de mi corazón. Ellas representan cuanto Dios quiere y desea habitar dentro de mí. Sin embargo, es el temor en realidad el que me separa del Señor. El temor de que si soy realmente honesto con el Señor, el no me podrá amar. Es lamentable saber cuanto la experiencia del amor humano tiende a calificar my relación con Dios.

Durante la Cuaresma el Señor nos llama a cada uno de nosotros de una manera especial. El nos llama para experimentar un cambio en nuestro corazón, para que tomemos el riesgo de creer en su palabra. Sin embargo, al escuchar su voz, yo necesito estar en silencio conmigo mismo, para así poder entrar en el silencio de mi mismo y permitir que Dios por medio de su Santa Palabra hable conmigo.

Cuando niño, yo aprendí que el pecado era una ofensa en contra de Dios. Es nuestra decisión por optar a darle la espalda e ignorar su presencia en la vida. Tomando en cuenta, que el pecado es una relación – una relación con Dios, con otros y con uno mismo. Es acerca de la elección que yo decida acerca de esas relaciones.

Es interesante regresarnos a analizar la historia de Adán y Eva. La historia del pecado de Adán es una historia verdadera acerca de las decisiones que uno toma. Desafortunadamente, la decisión que el y Eva decidieron elegir les causo a ambos vergüenza. Al haberse dado cuenta de las consecuencias de su decisión, ellos se llenaron de vergüenza. Ellos sintieron la necesidad de esconderse no solo de Dios pero de uno del otro, como de ellos mismos también. Lo mejor de la historia, es que Dios los busca y los llama desde su escondite, desde su vergüenza. No obstante que hubo consecuencias sobre su decisión, Dios nos les quita su amor o les da la espalda a ellos.

Lo que me entristece como sacerdote es darme cuenta que muchos de nosotros, como Adán y Eva, tratamos de escondernos de Dios en nuestra vergüenza. La vergüenza no viene de Dios sino de nosotros y de nuestro temor de no tomar el riesgo de permitir a Dios ser Dios. Yo encuentro, que nosotros a menudo jugamos juegos con nosotros mismos, tratando de minimizar la necesidad de mostrarnos limpios con Dios. Muchos de nosotros, incluyéndome a mi, somos muy buenos jugando estos juegos, justificando el porque yo no necesito ir a confesión. Sin embargo, yo he descubierto felizmente que el tratar de jugar estos juegos no funciona con Dios.

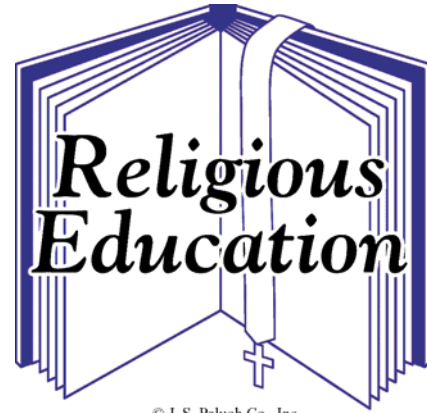

El sentarme en silencio y permitir que Dios me diga su historia, me ha ayudado a entender la profundidad de su amor por mí. La misma palabra *redención* señala no solamente su amor por mí, pero la importancia que Dios muestra al ver en mi algo hermoso y bueno, algo digno de redimir. Es por eso que he valorado el orar con la Escritura como una forma de preparación para el Sacramento de Penitencia

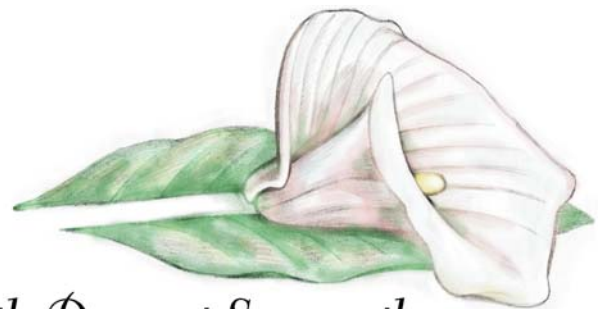

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Once again, there is legislation in Springfield that would violate personal conscience to pay for the killing of the unborn with public money.

The so-called "Reproductive Health and Access Act" has been re-introduced in the Illinois General Assembly as House Bill 6205. You may recall last year's version of this legislation, which sought to undermine healthcare workers' rights of conscience, nullify the existing regulations of abortion, publicly fund abortions and mandate comprehensive sex education. We had hoped that last year's widespread public opposition, and the inability of the proponents to advance their legislation to a vote, would dissuade policy makers from again proposing such an extreme and out of touch position.

This year's legislation has been amended so that its most egregious demand is the use of public money to pay for all "reproductive health services." These services include abortion, emergency contraception without pregnancy testing, and in-vitro fertilization for all Medicaid recipients, people on state health insurance plans, and any other programs providing state "medical assistance." If this legislation becomes law, money you send to state government to meet the shared needs of society will instead be used to fund abortion and emergency contraception without pregnancy testing. At the very least, to add this kind of expense to the budget now is irresponsible.

House Bill 6205 violates the conscientious objection of many citizens. In 1844, Abraham Lincoln broke with his own party, the often anti-Catholic Whigs, and proposed: "Resolved, that the guarantee of the rights of conscience, as found in our Constitution, is most sacred and inviolable, and one that belongs no less to the Catholic, than to the Protestant; and that all attempts to abridge or interfere with these rights, either of Catholic or Protestant, directly or indirectly, have our decided disapprobation, and shall ever have our most effective opposition." Lincoln's position is as valid today as it was last year and in 1844. The tax dollars of Catholics and many other conscientious people must not be used to subsidize the taking of innocent human life.

Accordingly, we again ask you to make your voice heard in Springfield. Please contact your elected representatives this week and urge them to oppose House Bill 6205. If your representative indicates that they oppose the legislation please thank them.

I work with the cancer program at Loyola University Health System, Cardinal Bernardin Cancer Center. Two of your parishioners, Jacqueline Griffith and Arlene Richert visited us today. They provided over 80 hand made hats for our adult and pediatric cancer patients. They also told us the loving story of their ministry.

The beauty of the hats, the generosity of materials and time, pales in comparison to their story of faith and love. They described a team of 35 women and 1 man who do this incredible work and pray for the people who will receive the hats. They described their prayers for comfort and peace. They informed us that you bless the hats. No explanation I can provide will be adequate to describe the impact these hats will have. Our patients are facing the fight of their lives often without adequate resources and support. To know that someone cares and is praying for them is a blessing and the hat makes it visible. 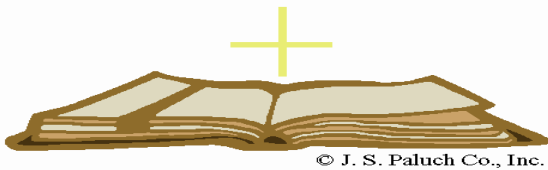
