

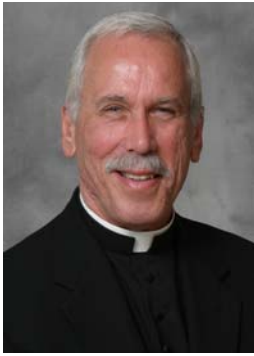

## *Reflections From the Pastor*

*God said, "Come no nearer!  
Remove the sandals from your feet,  
For the place where you stand is holy ground."  
- Exodus 3:8*

When I was pastor at St. Alexis in Bensenville, a Hindu Temple opened not far from the church. In fact, we loaned the church parking lot to the Hindus on the day their temple was dedicated. Our Hindu brothers and sisters invited us to visit their new temple – an invitation I gladly accepted. Arriving at the temple, I was told that I needed to remove my shoes before entering the temple. Removing my shoes, I thought of the passage from

Exodus that serves as the first reading of today's liturgy. I also thought of how much we Catholics have lost a sense of sacred space in our tradition.

Pope John Paul II, when visiting the Orthodox monastery of St. Catherine on Mt. Sinai, recalling the words of the Lord to Moses: "*Remove the sandals from your feet, for the place where you stand is holy ground*", removed his shoes and approached this holy place barefoot. The fact that he was crippled, suffering from Parkinson's, did not matter. Whatever pain he might have experienced removing his shoes and going barefoot or kneeling to kiss the holy ground matter not. His pain and discomfort was his prayer. A valuable lesson for us all!

Four years ago I was on sabbatical in Rome at the time of Holy Week. I had the privilege of being one of the ministers of Communion at the Good Friday Liturgy with the Holy Father. When it came time to venerate the Cross, the Holy Father first removed his shoes and then walked over to kneel and venerate the holy Cross. Once again I thought of the words of the Lord to Moses "*You are on holy ground.*"

For me the liturgy of the Sacred Triduum is powerful and profound. The power comes from the quiet simplicity of the liturgy and the music. The quiet and solemn tone leads one from the Upper Room to the Mount of Olives and from there to Calvary and later to the nearby tomb. Allowing one to enter into this grand drama of our salvation, into the solemn silence, one comes to look forward to that moment of Resurrection with the choir of alleluias on the dawn of Easter.

An important moment in the liturgy of the Triduum is when the priest removes the veil that covers the cross and sings "*Behold the Wood of the Cross on which hung our salvation*" to which the people respond "*Come, let us adore Him!*" For me this is our moment on Mt. Horeb. This is our moment to enter into the mystery of our salvation. It is for this reason that I carry the Cross barefoot and invite the assembly to join me in venerating the Cross without wearing shoes.

It is good to note that there is no celebration of the Eucharist from the time of the Lord's Supper on the evening of Holy Thursday until the conclusion of the Vigil of Easter on the night of Holy Saturday. In fact, no sacraments are celebrated during this time. Only with Vatican II was it permitted to receive Communion at the Good Friday liturgical service and only at that service. The only image during the Triduum the Church focuses attention is the Cross. And truly our approaching barefoot that holy Cross is a moment to experience a genuine with our God who hung, like a common thief, on that wood of our salvation.

*Dios dijo, “No se acerquen más!  
Quítense las sandalias de sus pies,  
Que la tierra donde usted se para es tierra santa.”*

Éxodo 3:8

Cuando yo era pastor en St. Bensenville, un templo Hindú no muy lejos de la iglesia abrió sus puertas. De hecho, nosotros les prestamos el estacionamiento de nuestra iglesia el mismo día que el templo hindú fue inaugurado. Nuestros hermanos y hermanas Hindús nos invitaron a visitar su templo nuevo – una invitación que acepte con gran entusiasmo. Cuando llegamos al templo, ellos nos dijeron que teníamos que quitarnos los zapatos antes de entrar al templo. Al quitarme los zapatos, yo recordé el pasaje de Éxodo que sirve como la primera lectura de la liturgia del día de hoy. En ese momento, yo también pensé cuántos de nosotros, los católicos, hemos perdido sentido sobre el espacio sagrado en nuestra tradición.

Cuando el Papa Juan Pablo II visitaba un monasterio Ortodoxo de St. Catherine en el Monte de Sinaí el recordó las palabras de nuestro Señor a Moisés: “Quítense las sandalias de sus pies, que la tierra donde están parados es tierra santa”, en eso el Papa Juan Pablo se quitó sus zapatos y continuó descalzo en ese lugar santo. El hecho de que él estuviera paralizado al sufrir el mal de Parkinson no fue un obstáculo. Cualquiera que hubiese sido el dolor o sufrimiento al haberse quitado los zapatos e ir descalzo o arrodillándose para besar ese lugar santo no fue barrera alguna.

Hace cuatro años, yo estuve en el sábado en Roma en el tiempo de la Semana Santa. Yo tuve el privilegio de ser uno de los ministros de la comunión en la liturgia del Viernes Santo con el Santo Padre. Cuando era el momento de venerar la Cruz, el Santo Padre primero se quitó sus zapatos y después caminó sobre sus rodillas y veneró la santa Cruz. Una vez más, yo pensé en las palabras del Señor a Moisés “Ustedes están en tierra santa.”

Para mí la liturgia del Triduo sagrado es poderosa y profunda. El poder viene de la calma y simplicidad de la liturgia y la música. La calma y el tono solemne te llevan desde la habitación más alta hasta el Monte de las Olivas y de ahí al Calvario y después a una tumba cercana. El permitir que uno sienta el gran drama de nuestra salvación, entre un silencio solemne, uno espera presenciar el momento de Resurrección con el coro de alabanza en el alba de la Pascua.

Un momento importante en la liturgia de Triduo, es cuando el padre remueve el velo que cubre la Cruz y canta “Contemple la Madera de la Cruz en la que permanece nuestra salvación” a la que la gente responde “Venga, déjenos adorarle a EL”. Para mí, este es nuestro momento en el Monte de Horeb. Este es nuestro momento para entrar en el misterio de nuestra salvación. Es por esta razón que yo cargo la Cruz descalzo e invito a la asamblea que venga conmigo para venerar la Cruz sin ponerse los zapatos.

Es bueno tomar en cuenta que no hay celebración de la Eucaristía desde el momento en que nuestro Señor tuvo La Última Cena en el Jueves Santo hasta la conclusión de la Vigilia de la Pascua en la noche del Sábado Santo. De hecho, ningún sacramento se celebra durante este tiempo. Únicamente en el Vaticano II, es permitido recibir comunión en el servicio litúrgico del Viernes Santo y únicamente en ese servicio. La única imagen que la Santa Iglesia enfoca su atención durante el Triduo es en la Santa Cruz. Verdaderamente, el contemplar la Santa Cruz descalzo es un momento para que apreciemos y sintamos como nuestro Señor fue crucificado, como un criminal, en la madera de nuestra salvación.

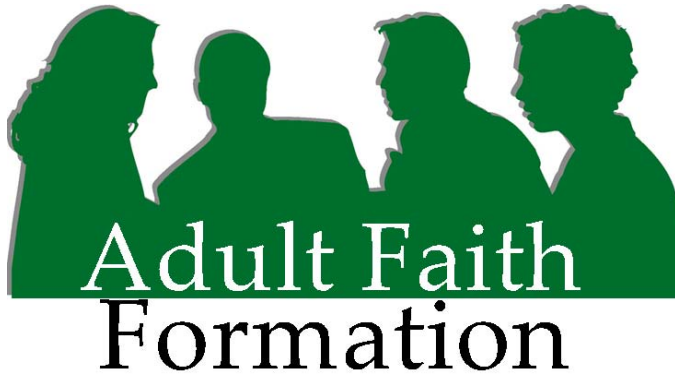

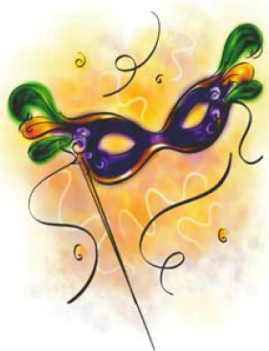

Thank you so very much on behalf of all the somber little faces you have turned to smiles.

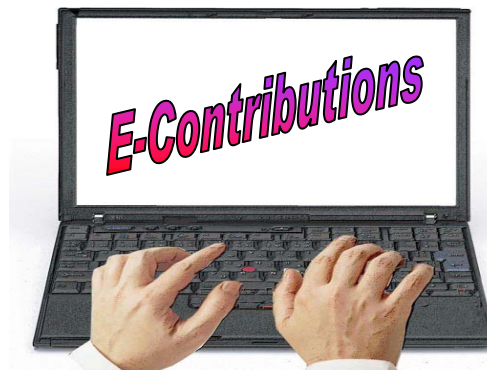
