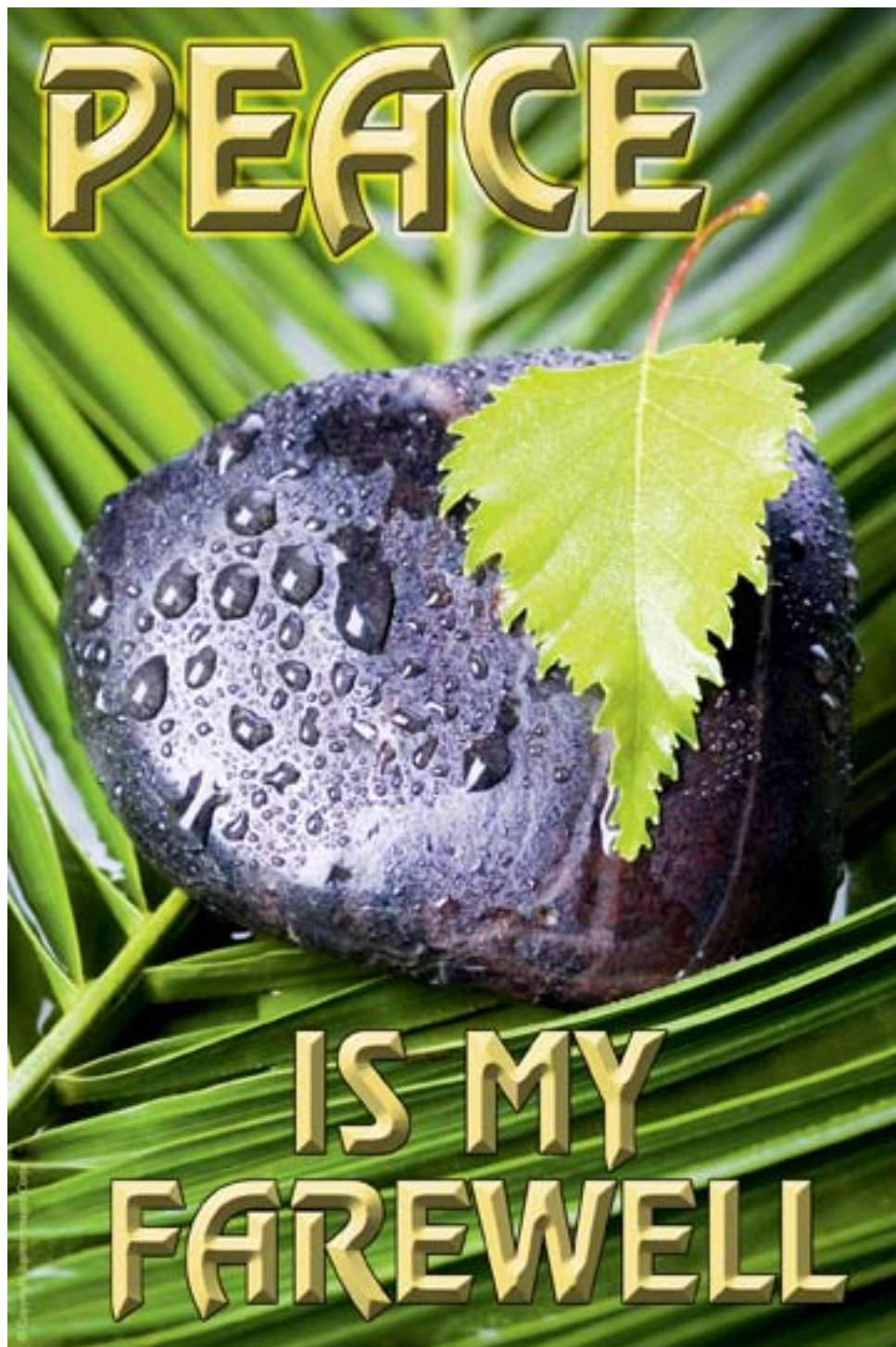

## Reflections From the Pastor

*We believe that we are saved through the grace of  
the Lord Jesus, in the same way as they.*

- Peter: Acts of the Apostles 15:11

During these 50 days of Easter the Church takes time to reflect on what Christ calls the Church to be. To help the Church in its reflection time is taken to read and reflect on the Acts of the Apostles that chronicles the struggle of the early Church in coming to understand what it means to be church in light of the resurrection.

It is clear from the New Testament that Jesus did not leave a clear road map for his disciples to follow. Initially they thought of themselves as simply another sect within Judaism. One needs to remember that Judaism in the time Jesus was as diverse as Christianity is today. Only gradually, especially after the final destruction of Jerusalem by Romans in 70 A. D., did the early followers of Jesus see themselves as something different and distinct from Judaism.

Because, as is clear from the gospels, Jesus was an observant Jew who participated both in the life of the synagogue and the temple, many of his early followers believed that those who are not Jewish (*goyim*) but wanted to join the disciples of the Way had to first embrace fully the practices of Judaism. They were teaching that before entering the community gentiles needed to undergo circumcision and observe all of the dietary laws of Torah.

Paul and his companion, Barnabas, strongly objected. So bitter was the dispute that they decided to go to Jerusalem and put the matter before the other apostles and presbyters. Hence it is in Acts (15), the text of today's first reading, that we have the account of the first ecumenical council of the Church, the *Council of Jerusalem*. At the end of the debate Peter in the name of those gathered, apostles (bishops?) and presbyters (priests?), speaks giving the decision of the Council. Paul and Barnabas prevail.

In reflecting on the account of the Council of Jerusalem, one sees two important issues: the issue of authority and the issue of culture. Two thousand years later they are still important and critical issues within the Church.

Regarding authority one sees a *collegial spirit* within the leadership of the early Church. Authority is not from the top down (hierarchical) rather it is concentric with Christ at the center. Peter in union with the other apostles speaks for the group (collegiality). It might be said in the collegial understanding of authority within the Church Peter is "*first among equals*". The question of papal authority and collegiality remains to this day a bone of contention.

The other issue is that of culture and its relationship to the gospel. A survey of the church's history through the ages reveals that there has always been a bias toward equating the gospel with the dominant culture in which it is proclaimed. The result has been unfortunately the exclusion of some. Pope Paul VI in his apostolic exhortation, *Evangelization in the Modern World*, in the spirit of the first Council of the Church, the Council of Jerusalem, makes quite clear the point that the gospel transcends culture. And while God reveals Himself through human history and culture, neither can ever fully capture the essence of God. While He is present in our history and in our cultural experience, He transcends both.

*Nosotros creemos que estamos salvados por la  
gracia de nuestro  
Señor Jesús, de la misma manera que ellos.  
- Pedro: Actos de los Apóstoles 15:11*

Durante estos 50 días de la Pascua, la iglesia toma un tiempo para reflexionar sobre lo que Cristo quería que la Iglesia fuera. Para ayudar a la iglesia en este tiempo de reflexión, hay que leer las crónicas de los Actos de los Apóstoles acerca de cuando el comienzo de la Iglesia al entender el significado de la iglesia en la luz de la resurrección.

Es claro que en el Nuevo Testamento Jesús no dejó un mapa claro para que sus discípulos se guiaran de él. Inicialmente pensaron de sí mismos como si ellos fueran simplemente otra secta dentro de judaísmo. Uno debe recordar que el judaísmo en el tiempo de Jesús fue tan diverso como la cristiandad es hoy. Fue que hasta gradualmente, especialmente después de la destrucción final de Jerusalén por romanos en 70 A. D., que los primeros seguidores de Jesús vieran en sí mismos que eran algo diferente y distinto que el Judaísmo.

Porque, como es claro en los evangelios, Jesús fue un judío atento que participó en la vida de la sinagoga y el templo de esta religión, y muchos de sus seguidores tempranos creyeron que los que no eran judíos (goyim) pero quisieron ser parte de los discípulos de la Manera tuvieron que aceptar primero completamente las prácticas de judaísmo. Ellos fueron enseñados que antes de entrar a los gentiles de la comunidad debieron experimentar circuncisión y seguir todas las leyes dietéticas de Torá (Torah).

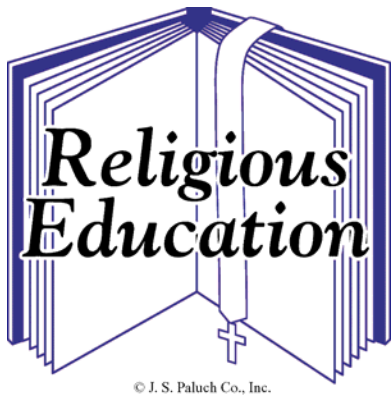
Paul y su compañero, Barnabas, totalmente estaba en desacuerdo. Entonces amarga fue la disputa que decidieron ir a Jerusalén y poner el asunto frente los otros apóstoles y presbíteros. Es por eso que ahí está en Actos (15), el texto de lectura primera de hoy, que tenemos la cuenta del primer concilio ecuménico de la Iglesia, el Concilio de Jerusalén. Al final del debate, Pedro habló en nombre de todos aquellos que se reunieron apóstoles (obispos)? y presbíteros (sacerdotes) y habló sobre la decisión del Concilio. Paul y Barnabas prevalecieron y la decisión estuvo de acuerdo con Paul y Barnabas.

Al reflexionar sobre el concilio de Jerusalem, uno puede ver dos aspectos importantes sobre este mismo: El problema de autoridad y el problema de cultura. Dos mil años después, estos dos problemas siguen siendo importantes y críticos dentro de la iglesia.

Con referencia a la autoridad, uno ve el espíritu colegial dentro del liderazgo de la Iglesia que apenas empezaba. La autoridad no viene de arriba hacia abajo (jerárquico) más bien es concéntrico con Cristo en el centro. En el caso de Pedro sobre la unión con los otros apóstoles habla por el grupo de manera colectiva (la colegialidad). Quizás sea dicho en la comprensión colegial (colectiva) de la autoridad dentro de la Iglesia que Pedro es "primero entre todos iguales". La pregunta de la autoridad y la colegialidad papal se queda actualmente como una manzana de la discordia.

El otro problema es sobre la cultura y esta relación con el evangelio. Una inspección de la historia de la iglesia después de un tiempo revela que siempre ha habido una tendencia hacia igualar el evangelio con la cultura dominante en la que es proclamado. El resultado ha sido desafortunadamente la exclusión de algunos. El Papa Paul VI en su exhortación apostólica, *la Evangelización en el Mundo Moderno*, en el espíritu del primer Concilio de la Iglesia, el Concilio de Jerusalén, las marcas vacían bastante el punto que el evangelio sobrepasa la cultura. Y mientras Dios se revela por la historia y las culturas humanas, ninguno jamás puede captar completamente la esencia de Dios. Mientras, es presente en nuestra historia y en nuestra experiencia cultural, El sobrepasa los dos.

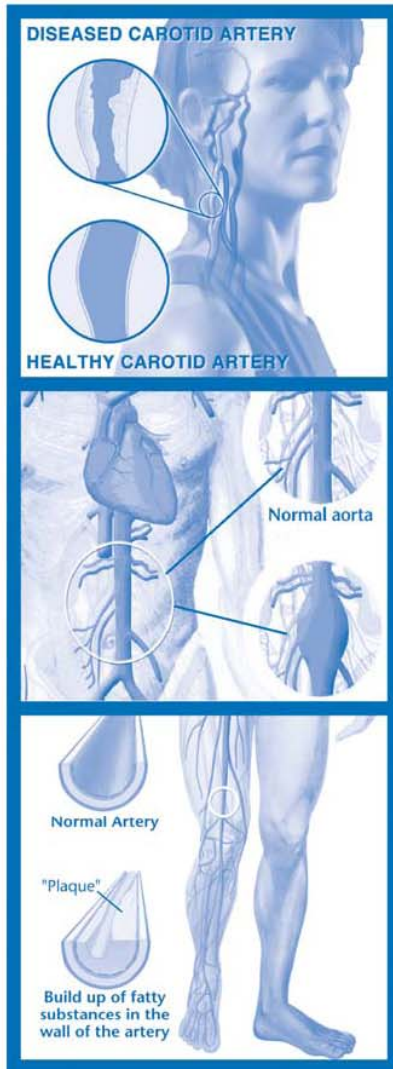

## FINANCE COUNCIL

Presently the Finance Council is working on next year's parish budget. Divine Savior has felt the effects of the recession, just as most of you in your households. While \$720,000 was budgeted for this year's parish Sunday collections (2009-10), the actual amount projected for this year will be \$679,611. Comparing that amount to what was received in the prior fiscal year (2008-09), being \$705,551, this year's collections have come in approximately \$26,000 short, meaning that while we averaged \$13,869 per Sunday as compared to the prior year, we came in \$500 short each Sunday.

This fall we will do the Diocesan Stewardship Program to raise the Sunday offerings as well as other income of the parish (e.g., Development Fund – Blue Envelopes). Hopefully we will be able to bring our collections up at least \$52,000+ in the coming year.

I am very grateful to everyone who in this difficult economic time has continued to be generous in their offerings each and every Sunday, and I am aware that for some to do so has meant a personal sacrifice. But if I may, could I perhaps suggest putting in your Sunday envelope \$1 more per Sunday, which would definitely bring us in line with the amount of money that we need per week for operating costs.

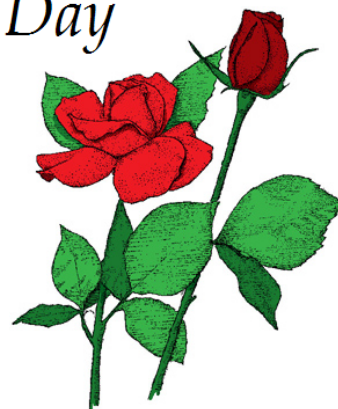

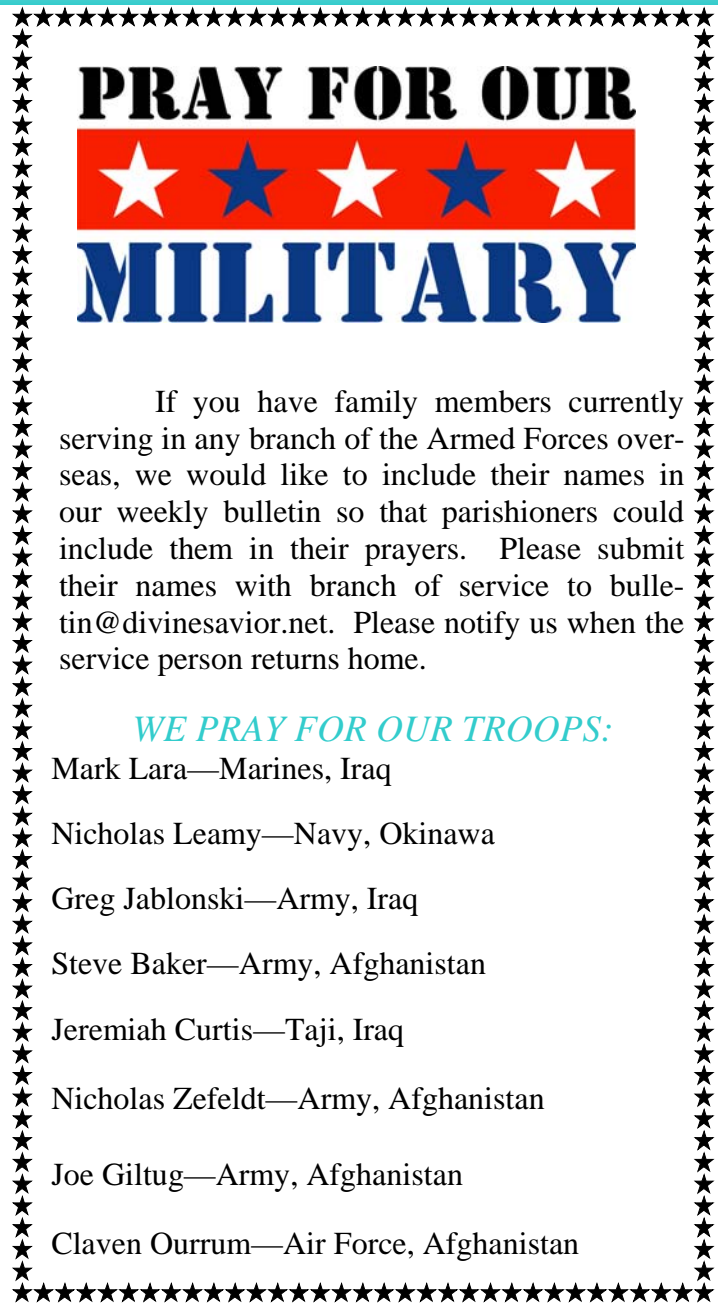

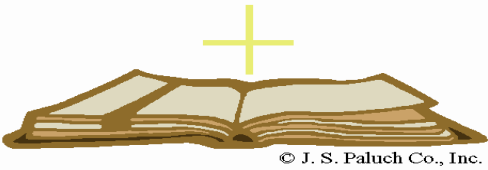
