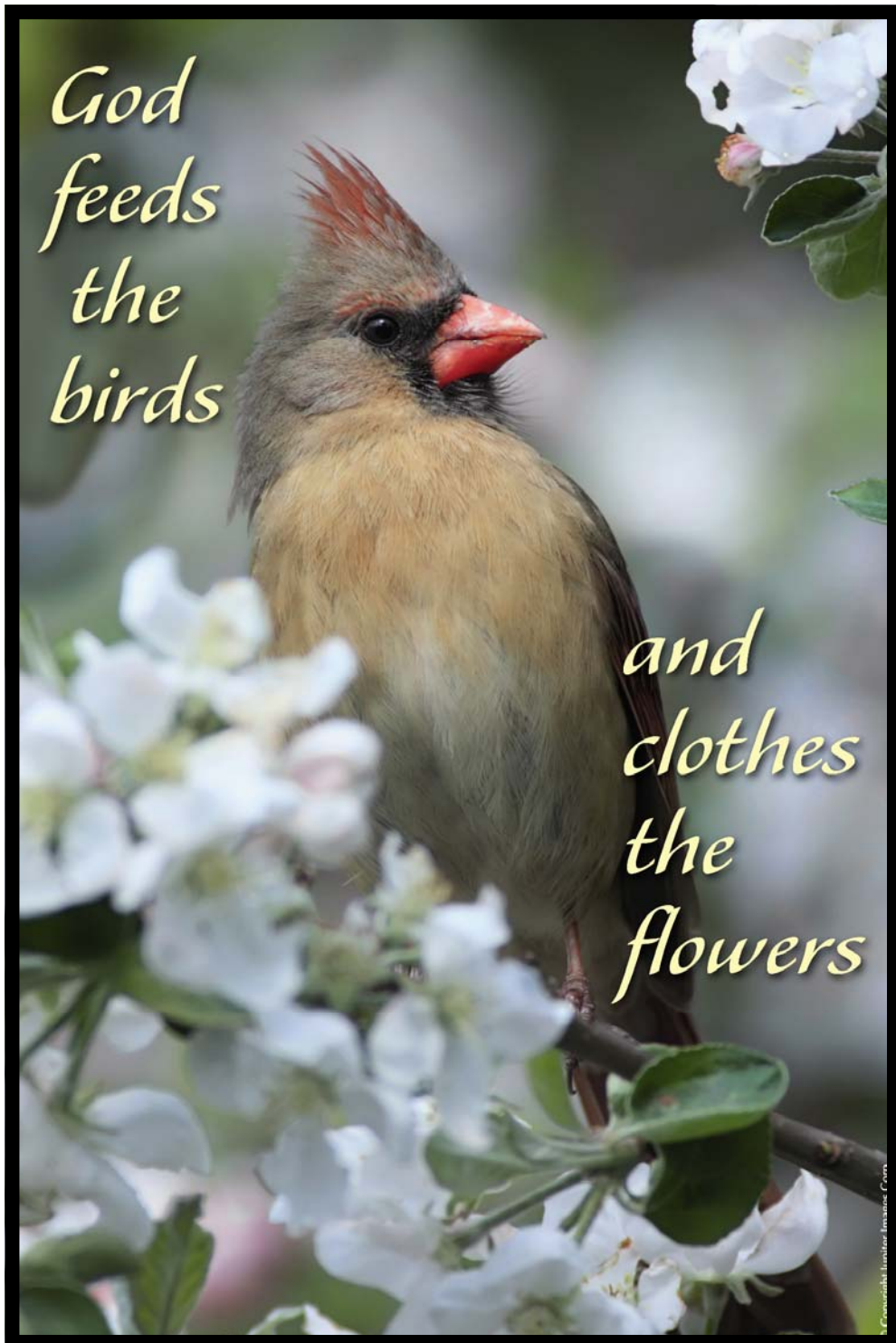

## *Reflections From the Pastor*

*“When you gather, do this in memory of Me”  
Jesus of Nazareth*

How often holding up the chalice at Mass I have ended with the words of Jesus *“Do this in memory of Me”*. For a time I never gave thought to what actually Jesus meant by these words. A common danger when one becomes too familiar with the words of prayer. However, as I reflect on these words two very important points surface in trying to understand what was meant by Jesus.

1. What is meant in speaking of the “*real presence*” of Jesus in the Eucharist? People sometimes tell me that they find Mass boring and they can experience God without going to Mass. In such a comment I hear:

- a) Mass is boring. Is Mass about being entertained or is Mass about centering myself in Prayer? Prayer requires discipline. I sometimes think of the words of Herod to Jesus in the musical Jesus Christ Superstar: *“If you are who you say you are, walk across my swimming pool.”* While it is important that our liturgies are well prepared, it is also important that we keep Christ in focus, and the reason why we prepare is to give to the Lord the best that we have.
- b) Secondly, I find in such a comment a lack of understanding of what the Mass is truly about and why Jesus gave us the Eucharist. For us, the liturgy is a work of service but also a moment to encounter Christ. I need to keep in focus that the Mass is a gift given to us by Jesus. Recalling the words from John’s gospel, *“Unless you eat my flesh and drink my blood, you shall not have life everlasting.”* I understand that it is I, not the Lord, who has the need to be present at Eucharist.

2. Going back to the words of Jesus *“Do this in memory of me”*, one needs to ask what is the antecedent to the pronoun “this”? What exactly does Jesus have in mind that we are to do in memory of Him? The answer is clear in the words of Jesus: *“Take and eat ... Take and drink”*. In other words, to participate in the Eucharist or the Mass, means the taking and eating and drinking, taking the Body of Christ and also drinking the Blood of Christ, in response to Christ’s command.

Yes it is true I can encounter God in many ways, in nature for example, however, the encounter with the Lord in the Eucharist is unique. I cannot encounter Christ in any other way in the same way as I encounter Him in the Eucharist. My reason for saying so is not so much because I believe it, as the fact that Jesus is the one that says this. This is why we speak of the action of receiving the Body and Blood of Christ as a moment of Communion in that Christ becomes “flesh of our flesh” and “bone of our bone”, or as St. Paul says: *“It is no longer I who lives but Christ who lives within me”*. To not participate in the Mass is to deny myself this unique and special opportunity for encountering the person of Jesus.

In this Year of the Eucharist that we are celebrating as a diocese, in preparation for the publication of the new *Roman Missal*, Catholics have a wonderful opportunity to reflect more deeply on the meaning of the Mass and to better understand why the church says that everything we do as a church, or a community of faith, *“Must either flow into or flow from what is celebrated at the Table of the Lord”*. In other words, it is as we gather at the Table of the Lord that we are truly church. Therefore, it is incumbent upon us, the members of the church, to deepen our understanding of the Eucharist so that we truly may be the church that Christ calls us to be.

"Cuando se reúnen, haced esto en memoria de mí"  
- Jesús de Nazaret

¿Con qué frecuencia sosteniendo el cáliz en la misa he acabado con las palabras de Jesús: "Haced esto en memoria mí". Durante un tiempo no me dio lo que realmente cree que Jesús quiso decir con estas palabras. Un peligro común cuando uno se vuelve demasiado familiarizado con las palabras de la oración. Sin embargo, al reflexionar sobre estas palabras de dos puntos de la superficie muy importante tratar de entender qué quiere decir Jesús.

1. ¿Qué quiere decir al hablar de la "presencia real" de Jesús en la Eucaristía? La gente a veces me dicen que les resulta aburrida la Misa y que pueden experimentar a Dios sin ir a Misa como un comentario que escucho:

Escucho:

a) La misa es aburrida. La misa es entretenimiento o la Misa es de ser centrado sobre mí mismo en Oración. La oración requiere disciplina. A veces pienso que las palabras de Herodes a Jesús en el musical Jesucristo Superstar: "Si usted es quien dice ser, caminar a través de mi piscina." Si bien es importante que nuestras liturgias están bien preparados, también es importante que nos seguimos enfocando en Cristo, y la razón por la que nos preparamos es para dar a Dios lo mejor que tenemos.

b) En segundo lugar, me parece de tal comentario la falta de comprensión de lo que la Misa es realmente y por qué Jesús nos dio la Eucaristía. Para nosotros, la liturgia es una obra de servicio, sino también un momento para encontrarse con Cristo. Debo mantener en el enfoque que la Misa es un regalo que nos dio Jesús. Recordando las palabras del Evangelio de Juan, "Si no coméis mi carne y bebe mi sangre, no tendréis vida eterna." Entiendo que soy yo, no el Señor, que tiene la necesidad de estar presente en la Eucaristía.

2. Volviendo a las palabras de Jesús: "Haced esto en memoria mía", uno debe preguntarse: ¿cuál es el antecedente del pronombre "esto"? ¿Qué es exactamente lo que Jesús tiene en mente que debemos hacer en memoria de Él? La respuesta es clara en las palabras de Jesús: "Tomad y comed ... Tomad y bebed". En otras palabras, a participar en la Eucaristía o la Misa, mediante la toma y el comer y beber, tomar el Cuerpo de Cristo y beber la Sangre de Cristo, en respuesta al mandato de Cristo.

Sí es cierto que puedo encontrar a Dios de muchas maneras, en la naturaleza, por ejemplo, sin embargo, el encuentro con el Señor en la Eucaristía es único. No puedo encontrar a Cristo en cualquier otra forma de la misma manera como yo lo encuentro en la Eucaristía. Mi razón para decir lo que no es tanto porque yo lo creo, como el hecho de que Jesús es el que dice esto. Por eso hablamos de la acción de recibir el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo como un momento de comunión en que Cristo se convierte en "carne de nuestra carne" y "hueso de nuestros huesos", o como St. Paul dice: "No es soy yo quien vive, sino Cristo quien vive en mí". De no participar en la Misa es negarme a mí mismo esta oportunidad única y especial para encontrarse con la persona de Jesús.

En este Año de la Eucaristía que estamos celebrando como una diócesis, en preparación para la publicación del nuevo Misal Romano, los católicos tienen una maravillosa oportunidad para reflexionar más profundamente sobre el significado de la Misa y para entender mejor por qué la iglesia dice que todo que hacemos como una iglesia o una comunidad de fe, "o bien debe fluir en o el flujo de lo que se celebra en la Mesa del Señor". En otras palabras, es cuando nos reunimos en la mesa del Señor que somos verdaderamente la iglesia. Por lo tanto, corresponde a nosotros, los miembros de la iglesia, para profundizar nuestra comprensión de la Eucaristía para que pueda ser verdaderamente la Iglesia que Cristo nos llama a ser.

**“NOT TO WORRY...”**

I am unsure where I picked up that phrase, “not to worry”, but I use it often (though I must admit it doesn’t always work for me!). Today’s Gospel is a familiar one, one that speaks to the futility of worry. Jesus asks his disciples the question: “Can any of you by worrying add a single moment to your life-span?” Of course, for those long-ago disciples and for us, today’s disciples – the answer is a resounding “No”. Sometimes, however, there seems to be so much bad news that many of us are left pummeled and disturbed.

One favorite author of mine, Anne Lamott, spoke about worry in her book, Grace (Eventually: Thoughts on Faith). One of the chapters is on the Wailing Wall; the author was preparing to teach children at her church about the Wailing Wall in Jerusalem. She explained how people came to the wall asking God for help, trusting in His love and stuck a prayer into the cracks on this wall. The lesson was on Letting Go. “See, sometimes, if you’re lucky, you get to a point where you’re sick of a problem or worn down by tinkering with it, or clutching it. And letting it go, maybe writing it down and sending it away, buys you some time and space, so maybe freedom and humor sneak in – which is probably what you were praying for all along.” Then she asked her co-teacher and friend, Neshama, whether she had anything to add about letting go. Neshama responded: “You do what you can. Then you get out of the way, because you’re not the one who does the work.”

“Not to worry” seems to be today’s Gospel message, or as one of my pastors used to say: “Let Go and Let God!”

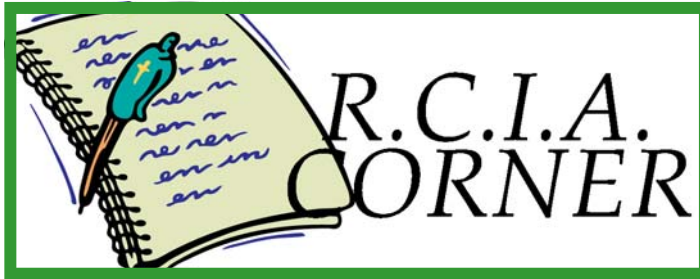

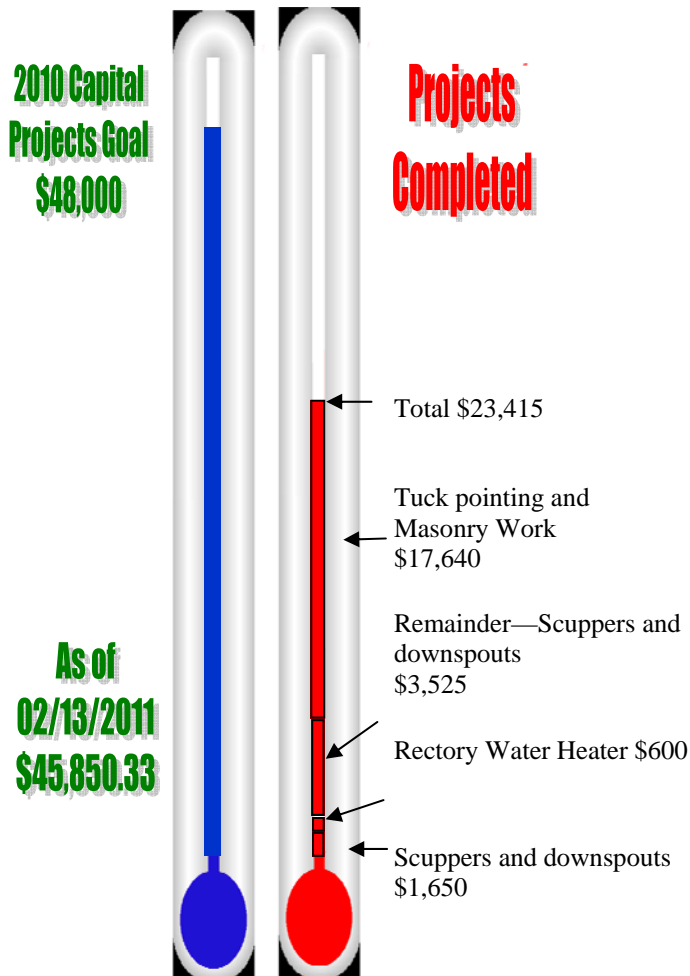

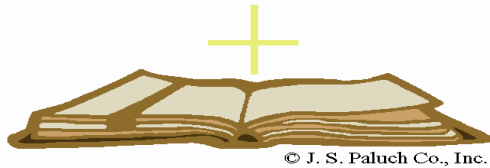

Anyone seeking information about becoming a fully participating member of the Catholic Faith should contact the Parish Office. Classes begin in September.
