Reflections From the Pastor

*“Whenever you gather in my Name
do this in memory of Me!”
- Jesus of Nazareth*

The other day I happened to tune in to an interview with Cardinal George talking about the *Catholics Come Home* campaign. He was talking about the drop off in church attendance by American Catholics. In that discussion he mentioned something that resonated with me. Studies have shown that those young Catholics who regularly attend Mass through the college years to the age of twenty-three will continue to actively participate in Mass in the years to come. In other words, it is critical that young Catholic adults remain engaged in the life of the Church.

Since Christmas I have been taking time to look at some parish demographics, as well as our financial situation. I have also spent time praying over what I am seeing, as well as what I heard from the parish listening sessions. While I have concerns about parish finances, I am much more concerned about the number of registered families who do not come and join the community at the Table of the Lord on Sunday. The parish register says that Divine Savior has almost 1,800 families. But both Mass attendance and support of the Church tells a very different story. In actuality, Divine Savior has around 850 families - active families.

I have also taken time to look at our Religious Education program. There are a little over 400 students (200+ families). Beginning last year each class took a turn at the Sunday 10:00 a.m. liturgy. What I have observed is that only around 30% of a given grade comes to the Mass, even though the date appears on the calendar and the catechists make reminder phone calls. What I am seeing and I find it troubling is that somewhere there is a disconnect. Families are good about having their children come for catechism class, but do not see the connection between the classroom and the Mass. It used to be said that “the family that prays together, stays together.”

As pastor, I am responsible for the spiritual life of the people of Divine Savior. This is something I take very seriously. It has been for this reason I initiated the *listening sessions* as an important way to know all of you and to better understand the spiritual needs of the parish community. It is difficult to pastor a community if one does not know whom they have been sent to pastor.

Keeping this in mind, I have launched a project to meet individually with every family that has a child in Divine Savior Religious Formation program. Over the next six months I have scheduled time (15 minute sessions) to meet with parents. First and foremost, I see these interviews as a way to have a better understanding of our families and to hear what Church means for them. The goal is have all families in the parish religious education program participating in the Sunday Mass. Hence, the name of this project is *Come to the Table*.

Obviously for me to meet with 200+ families over the next six months means investing a great deal of my time to this project, but I believe it is an investment I am called by the Lord to make. These interviews are not about chastising or judging. I earnestly want to know what Catholic families think about Church and how they see the Church in the life of their family. Genuine communication is about listening as speaking – dialogue.

I would ask that we as parish community pray for the success of this project – *Come to the Table*. I also want to challenge all of us who come faithfully to the Lord’s Table to reach out to others and invite them to the Table. This is what it means to be an *evangelizing community*.

El otro día se me ocurrió sintonizar una entrevista con el Cardenal George hablando de la campaña de Católicos Regresen a Casa. Él estaba hablando de la caída en asistencia a la iglesia por los católicos de América. En ese debate se refirió a algo que resonó en mí. Los estudios han demostrado que los jóvenes católicos que asisten regularmente a Misa a través de los años de la universidad a la edad de veintitrés años, seguirá participando activamente en la Misa en los próximos años. En otras palabras, es fundamental que los jóvenes adultos católicos sigan participando en la vida de la Iglesia.

Desde la Navidad he estado tomando el tiempo para ver algunos datos demográficos de la parroquia, así como nuestra situación financiera. También he pasado tiempo orando por lo que estoy viendo, así como lo que escuché de las sesiones de escucha parroquia. Aunque me preocupa acerca de las finanzas de la parroquia, estoy mucho más preocupado por el número de familias registradas que no ven y únete a la comunidad en la Mesa del Señor el domingo. El registro de la parroquia Divino Salvador dice que tiene casi 1.800 familias. Sin embargo, tanto la asistencia a misa y el apoyo de la Iglesia cuenta una historia muy diferente. En la actualidad, Divino Salvador tiene alrededor de 850 familias - las familias activas.

También he tenido tiempo de mirar en nuestro programa de Educación Religiosa. Hay un poco más de 400 estudiantes (200 familias). A partir del año pasado cada una de ellas dio un giro en el domingo de 10:00 liturgia. Lo que he observado es que sólo alrededor del 30% al grado llega a la misa, a pesar de que la fecha aparece en el calendario y los catequistas realizar llamadas de recordatorio de teléfono. Lo que estoy viendo y me parece preocupante es que en algún lugar hay una desconexión. Las familias es bueno de tener a sus hijos llegan a la clase de catecismo, pero no ven la conexión entre el aula y la misa se solía decir que "la familia que reza unida, permanece unida".

Como pastor, yo soy responsable de la vida espiritual del pueblo de Divino Salvador. Esto es algo que tomamos muy en serio. Ha sido por esta razón por la que inició las sesiones de música como un medio importante para conocer a todos ustedes y para entender mejor las necesidades espirituales de la comunidad parroquial. Es difícil de pastorear una comunidad si no se sabe quienes han sido enviados al pastor.

Teniendo esto en mente, me han puesto en marcha un proyecto para reunirse individualmente con cada familia que tiene un hijo en Divino Salvador del programa de Formación Religiosa. En los próximos seis meses que ha programado el tiempo (sesiones de 15 minutos) para reunirse con los padres. En primer lugar, veo que estas entrevistas como una manera de tener una mejor comprensión de nuestras familias y para escuchar lo que la Iglesia significa para ellos. El objetivo es que todas las familias en el programa de educación religiosa parroquial que participan en la misa del domingo Por lo tanto, el nombre de este proyecto es llegar a la mesa.

Obviamente para mí para reunirse con más de 200 familias durante los próximos seis meses es invertir una gran parte de mi tiempo a este proyecto, pero creo que es una inversión que estoy llamado por el Señor para hacer. Estas entrevistas no son para castigar o juzgar. Yo sinceramente quiero saber lo que las familias católicas piensan de la Iglesia y cómo ven a la Iglesia en la vida de su familia. La comunicación auténtica es escuchar como hablar - el diálogo.

Quisiera pedir que la comunidad parroquial como orar por el éxito de este proyecto - Ven a la mesa. También quiero desafiar a todos los que vienen fielmente a la mesa del Señor para llegar a otros e invitarlos a la Mesa. Esto es lo que significa ser una comunidad evangelizadora.

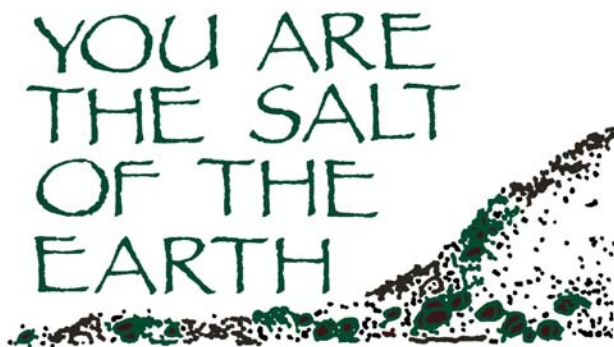

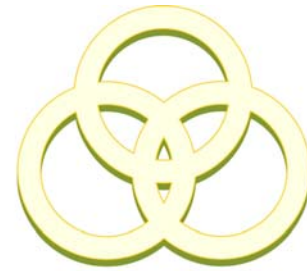
St. Joseph/Divine Savior Grand Raffle

Goal: To touch the hearts of 120 seniors by your generosity and the help of the Peer Ministers and teens of Divine Savior.



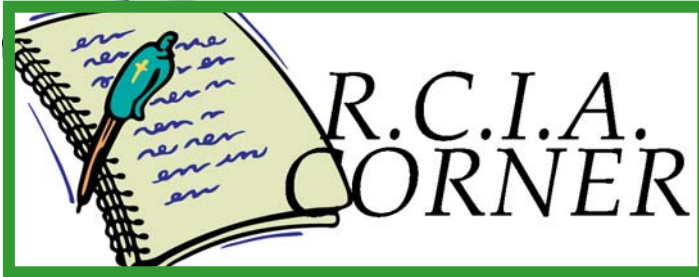

GOD’S CALL

The person who has been “saved,” who has “heard the good news of salvation,” still lives in an unsaved world, a world sadly oblivious to the presence of God. Today’s readings outline how the disciple is present in the world. The outline begins with Isaiah: “Share your bread . . . shelter the oppressed . . . clothe the naked” (Isaiah 58:7). Those who hear the word of salvation are not insensitive to the urgent needs of others. Then Paul reminds his flock that he brought Christ to them not in eloquence or wisdom, but by being with them in the “weakness and fear” of their daily lives (1 Corinthians 2:3). Finally, Jesus tells his disciples to go out into the gloom and darkness of the streets of the world and let God’s light shine through their good deeds. We disciples don’t save the world. To the extent, however, that we have heard the word of God and been awakened to God’s presence, we may spread that word and bring that presence to others.

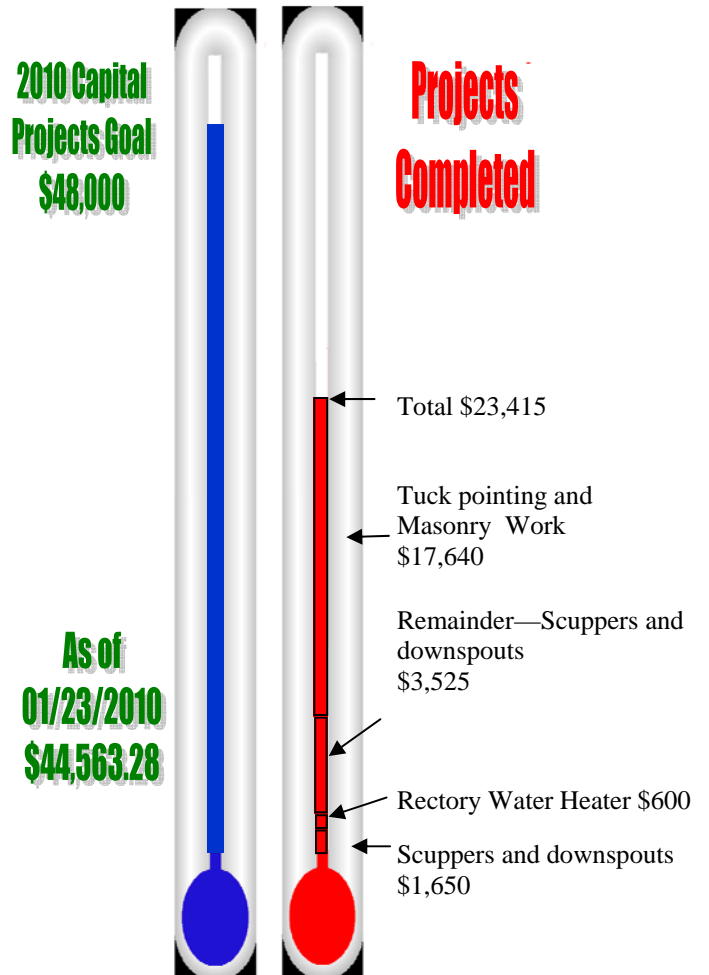
Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

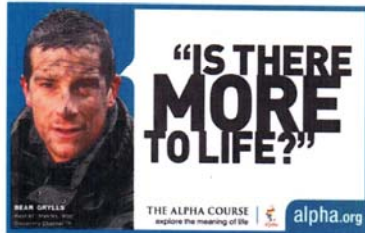
