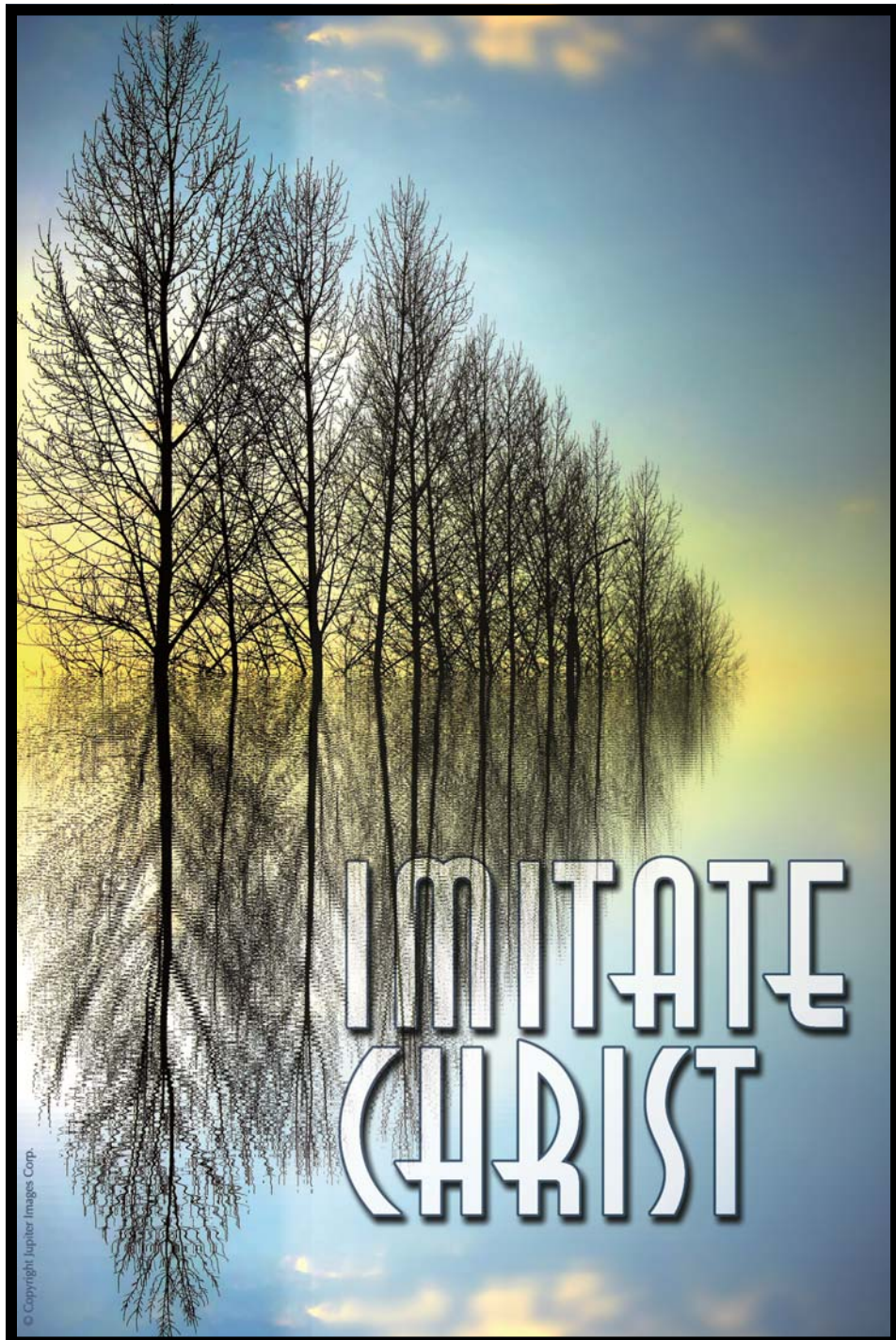

Dear Friends in Christ,

On January 20th an agency of the federal government created a **serious threat to the freedom of religion** guaranteed by the First Amendment of the U.S. Constitution. As Americans and Christians, we must take steps to counter this threat.

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services issued a directive that all private health care insurance programs must include several reproductive services for women. These services must be provided without any co-pay or deductible. Among the services are FDA-approved prescription contraceptives (some of which can cause early abortion), sterilization procedures and related education and counseling. The directive applies to religious employers, even if the services in question violate their moral principles. It also places an unnecessary burden of conscience on other employers, Catholic and otherwise, who consider these services immoral.

The directive does provide an exemption for some religious employers, but the terms of exemption are very narrow. The employer must employ primarily members of its own faith and serve primarily members of its own faith. Certainly most Catholic hospitals would not qualify for an exemption and perhaps many Catholic universities. Catholic Charities would not qualify. It could be argued that Catholic dioceses, parishes and schools likewise do not qualify, since Christ clearly sent his followers to proclaim the Gospel to everyone, to invite everyone into his Kingdom and to serve all who are in need. The Church doesn't exist just to take care of its own.

Now, it is no secret that many Catholics dissent from the Church's longstanding teaching on artificial contraception, elective sterilization and abortion. However, pursuing old arguments on these issues will sidetrack us from the real one at hand. **The Health and Human Services directive is a violent breach of the wall of separation between church and state. For the government to force a religious body to pursue a course of action that contradicts its beliefs, particularly where no public interest is at stake, is completely unacceptable.**

Throughout the history of this country, religious groups, certainly the Catholic Church, have made good use of religious liberty by contributing enormously to the common good. We have run hospitals and nursing homes that cared for everyone, especially the poor. We built universities and schools that educated millions of people who went on to develop this nation. Every day we feed the hungry, clothe the naked, shelter the homeless, fight for the oppressed and in many other ways give hope to the downtrodden—all done in the name of God, all done because of our faith.

Now our ability to carry out many of these apostolates is at stake, and many of our dedicated employees are potentially at risk of losing their medical insurance.

Your help is greatly needed, both as Christians and as Americans. First, please pray that this grave threat to religious liberty be stopped. Surely, if the gates of hell cannot prevail against the Church, God can manage a cabinet department. Second, support whatever efforts I may ask you to support in the future, such as legislative or judicial remedies. Even now, you can contact the President, the Secretary of Health of Human Services, and your members of Congress. Third, be courageous in your conviction. Take action of your own. The United States is a great country. It was founded by people who sought freedom, initially, religious freedom. The first right enshrined in the Bill of Rights is the free exercise of religion. We are justifiably proud that in this country people of virtually every faith on earth are able to pursue their religious objectives in peace and friendship. Our federal government should help preserve and promote that heritage. Let us work together at this moment to assure that it does.

God bless all of you, whom I am privileged to shepherd in the name of Christ.

Queridos amigos en Cristo,

El día 20 de enero, una agencia federal del gobierno hizo una seria amenaza a la libertad de religión, garantizada por la Primera Enmienda de la Constitución de los Estados Unidos. Como americanos y cristianos, debemos tomar acciones para enfrentar esta amenaza.

El Departamento de Salud y Servicios Humanos de los Estados Unidos emitió una directiva para que todos los programas de salud privados, incluyan algunos servicios de fertilización para la mujer. Estos servicios deben ser proveídos sin deducible ni pago compartido. Dentro de estos servicios se encuentran anticonceptivos aprobados por el FDA (algunos de los cuales pueden causar un aborto temprano), procedimientos de esterilización, educación y consejería relacionados a esto. La directiva aplica a empleadores religiosos, aun cuando los servicios en cuestión, violan sus principios morales. Esto pone una carga innecesaria sobre la conciencia de otros empleadores, católicos y otros, quienes consideran estos servicios inmorales.

La directiva provee una excepción a algunos empleadores religiosos; sin embargo, los términos de la excepción son muy estrechos. El empleador debe contratar a miembros de su misma fe y servir primordialmente a miembros de su misma fe. Ciertamente, la mayoría de los hospitales católicos no calificarían dentro de la excepción y, tal vez muchas universidades católicas tampoco. Caridades Católicas no calificaría. Se podría argumentar que las diócesis, parroquias y escuelas tampoco calificarían, ya que Cristo envió a sus seguidores a proclamar el Evangelio a todos, y a invitarlos a su Reino y servir a todos aquellos que están en necesidad. La Iglesia no existe solo para cuidar de los suyos.

Ahora, no es ningún secreto que muchos católicos están en desacuerdo con las enseñanzas sobre los anticonceptivos, esterilizaciones y abortos, por elección propia. Sin embargo, entrar en estos viejos argumentos, sería desviarnos de la realidad que tenemos ahora en mano. **La directiva de Salud y Servicios Humanos es un puente violento a las paredes que separan a la Iglesia del Estado. Para que el gobierno fuerce a un cuerpo religioso a seguir un curso de acción que contradice sus creencias, particularmente cuando ningún interés público está en juego, es completamente inaceptable.**

A través de la historia de este país, grupos religiosos, específicamente la Iglesia Católica, ha hecho buen uso de sus libertades religiosas al contribuir enormemente al bien general. Hemos administrado hospitales y asilos en los cuales cuidamos de todos, especialmente de los pobres. Hemos construido universidades y escuelas que han educado a millones de personas, que han ido desarrollando a esta nación. Cada día le damos alimento al hambriento, vestimos al desnudo, albergamos al desamparado, luchamos por los

oprimidos y, de muchas maneras, les damos esperanza al marginado: todo esto en el nombre de Dios y de nuestra fe.

Ahora, nuestra capacidad de continuar con muchos de estos apostolados está en riesgo, y muchos de nuestros ejemplares empleados están en riesgo de perder sus seguros médicos.

Necesitamos de su ayuda, como cristianos y como americanos. Primero, le pido que ore para que esta grave amenaza a la libertad de religión sea detenida. Seguramente, si las puertas del infierno no podrán prevalecer contra la Iglesia, Dios podrá arreglar estas situaciones que se presentan. Segundo, apoye cualquier esfuerzo que yo le pueda pedir en el futuro, tales como enmiendas legislativas o judiciales. Aun hoy, usted puede contactar al Presidente, a la Secretaría de Salud y Servicios Humanos, y a miembros del Congreso. Tercero, sea fuerte en sus convicciones. Tome usted mismo acción. Dear Parishioners,

In our ongoing effort to keep you informed of the financial status of the Parish, we are presenting the financial statement of activity for the first six months of our fiscal year. We have expanded the report to show not only the actual numbers but the budget to date and where we were at this same time last fiscal year (2010-11).

While Sunday collections are below what we were hoping, due to cuts by our staff we are able to meet our bills. Thanks to your generous Christmas collection, as of the end of January we are current with all our obligations to outside vendors as well as to the Diocese.

Our obligation to the Diocese for employee health insurance and assessment exceeds \$12,000 monthly. This is often equal to a one week collection. This number does not include salaries or other regular expenses (utilities, maintenance, supplies etc.). Property insurance and retirement obligations amount to over \$40,000 annually. In order to assist the Parish in meeting its expenses, our entire staff from Fr. Bill on down took a 2% reduction in their salaries for this fiscal year.

Tuition revenue from our Religious Education Program is lower than expected, as enrollment for this school year is lower than it has been in the past couple of years. Our Pastoral Council, which is presently in formation, will be looking at this decrease in the near future.

Our Blue Envelope campaign to assist with capital improvements was very successful this past calendar year raising over \$70,000, and the Buildings and Grounds Committee was able to complete most of the proposed projects during that time. They have presented their proposals for next year and rely on your generous support to keeping our aging physical plant working and safe.

Once again, thank you all for your generosity. If at any time you would like more detailed numbers or information, please feel free to contact Fr. Bill or Sue Hartig in our Parish Office. May the Lord continue to bless Divine Savior, its mission and its people.

MUSIC MINISTRIES

At Divine Savior Parish, we are gifted with a music ministry of choirs, cantors, and instrumentalists whose primary goal is to support the active participation of the gathered assembly. Music ministers give of their talent and time to support the assembly in its worship. From choir member to cantor to accompanist to instrumentalist – anyone can take a role! We are just “ordinary parishioners” who together do something extraordinary!

Cantor

Cantors serve as “animators” of the assembly’s song for all Sunday and Holy Day liturgies. Individual formation and training is offered in this ministry as well as group bi-monthly practice.

Choir

The choir serves the parish as music ministers for the 8:00a.m. Sunday Mass. This choral group supports and enhances the assembly’s song and sings in a variety of musical styles. Rehearsals are held in the church on Thursdays from 7:00 – 8:30p.m.

Contemporary Ensemble

The singers and musicians serve the parish as music ministers for the 10:00a.m. Mass throughout the year. In addition to singers, the group also uses a variety of instruments to support and enhance the assembly’s song. Rehearsals are on Wednesdays at 7:00p.m.

Instrumentalists

All instruments can be used to embellish the music at liturgy. Guitar, trumpet, bass, percussion, strings, and any other instrument add additional color and enhance the environment for worship. If you play an instrument, please know that you can share your gifts in a unique way. Rehearsals are arranged on an individual basis.

Chorister

Children in grades four through eight are invited to form this vocal group. The Choristers serve as the music ministers once a month at Sunday Mass and for Easter and Christmas liturgies. The young people learn to sing and appreciate many styles of music, but more importantly, they take their place as ministers of music for the liturgy. Rehearsals will be held on select Tuesdays from 5:45-6:45p.m. in the church beginning on February 21st.

Resurrection Choir

The members of the Resurrection Choir are present to the bereaving family and friends by supporting the assembly’s participation in word and song at the funeral Mass. There are no auditions – all are welcome. Members come as often as their schedules allow. The choir arrives one- half hour before the funeral to rehearse any special music that is needed. Funerals are normally in the mornings. Choir members are informed by phone or e-mail.
