Reflections From the Pastor

*Each year you give us this joyful season
when we prepare to celebrate the paschal mystery
with mind and heart renewed.
- Lenten Eucharistic Preface*

I've always been struck by these words found in the Preface of the Mass. Quite honestly, my background has taught me that Lent is about being more on the miserable side than the joyful side. After all, we are supposed to do penance, abstaining from meat, fasting between meals, giving of alms, etc. I've often joked that the reason I have bad knees is because in the high school seminary, I spent so much time on my knees doing penance (you see, I wasn't exactly a "saintly" student).

So the question now becomes what does the church mean in speaking of Lent as this joyful time, and in what sense can we say that Lent is joyful? I think the key is found in the notion of the paschal mystery of Christ's suffering, dying, and rising. This mystery is about the fact that the Lord God sees in each and every one of us something of value, something worth redeeming. It is for that reason that He has sent His son.

Lent offers one an opportunity to look at oneself in a different way; to look at oneself as God does. Meaning that I am challenged to discover in my being what God sees is worth redeeming. In fact, this is why we call the Word of God good news. That despite our sinfulness, God always sees something in us that is good and holy.

I am reminded of the words found in the Holy Torah where the Lord God says to His people "Be holy as I, your God, am holy." Once again, holiness begins in God Himself and in our ability to look at ourselves and others the way God sees us. So often it is easier to focus on the negative, to beat one's breast with endless "*mea culpas*." In doing so, to become more centered on self than on God.

This Lent I would like to challenge all of us to truly make this a joyful season. The season where I see the practices of Lent, whether fasting or abstaining, or the giving of the alms, as something I do joyfully and willingly. I fast not so much to deny myself as to provide for others what I have and they do not have, and so the giving of alms is a way of providing to others some of the blessings that I have received and for being an instrument of God's blessings. A little time on the knees doesn't necessarily hurt, even for us who have arthritis, for there are many who live constantly in pain and perhaps my little brief moment of pain helps me to be in solidarity with those who suffer much greater pain.

And I pray that all of us have a joyful and delightful Lent.

Cada año, usted nos da alegría en esta temporada cuando nos preparamos para celebrar el misterio pascual con la mente y corazón renovado.
-Cuaresma Prefacio eucarística

Siempre he estado impresionado por estas palabras en el prefacio de la Misa Sinceramente, mi experiencia me ha enseñado que la Cuaresma se trata de ser más en el lado miserable que el lado alegre. Después de todo, se supone que debemos hacer penitencia, abstinencia de carne, el ayuno entre comidas, dar limosna, etc. Muchas veces he bromeado que la razón por la que tiene mal las rodillas es porque en la escuela secundaria de seminario, pasé mucho tiempo en mis rodillas haciendo penitencia (ver, no era precisamente un "santo" estudiante).

Así que la pregunta ahora es ¿qué hace la iglesia decir al hablar de la Cuaresma como en esta ocasión alegre, y en qué sentido podemos decir que la Cuaresma es alegre? Creo que la clave se encuentra en la noción del misterio pascual del sufrimiento de Cristo, muriendo, y en aumento. Este misterio es el hecho de que el Señor Dios ve en todos y cada uno de nosotros algo de valor, algo digno de redención. Es por eso que Él ha enviado a su hijo.

Cuaresma ofrece una oportunidad de mirar a uno mismo de una manera diferente, a mirar a sí mismo como Dios lo hace. Lo que significa que soy el reto de descubrir en mí lo que Dios ve en valor redentor. De hecho, es por eso que llamamos la Palabra de Dios, buena noticia. Que a pesar de nuestros pecados, Dios siempre ve algo en nosotros que es bueno y santo.

Me acuerdo de las palabras encontradas en la Santa Torah, donde el Señor dice que su pueblo "Sed santos como yo, tu Dios, soy santo." Una vez más, la santidad comienza en el mismo Dios y en nuestra capacidad para mirarnos a nosotros mismos y los demás la manera en que Dios nos ve. Muy a menudo es más fácil centrarse en lo negativo, para vencer a un ingenio de mamá sin fin "*mea culpa*". De este modo, a ser más centrado en sí mismo que en Dios.

Esta Cuaresma me gustaría retar a todos nosotros para que realmente esta una temporada gozosa. La temporada en que veo las prácticas de la Cuaresma, ya sea en ayunas o la abstención o la entrega de la limosna, como algo que hago con alegría y buena voluntad. He de ayunar, no tanto para negar a mí mismo como para dar a otros lo que tengo y tu no tienes, y así la limosna es una manera de proporcionar a los demás algunas de las bendiciones que he recibido y por ser un instrumento de Dios bendiciones. Un poco de tiempo en las rodillas no necesariamente daño, incluso para nosotros que tienen artritis, porque hay muchos que viven constantemente en el dolor y tal vez mi pequeño momento breve de dolor me ayuda a ser solidarios con los que sufren el dolor mucho mayor.

Y pido que todos nosotros tenemos una Cuaresma alegre y encantador.

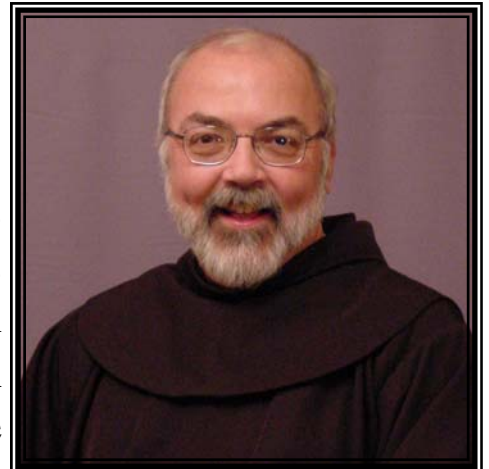

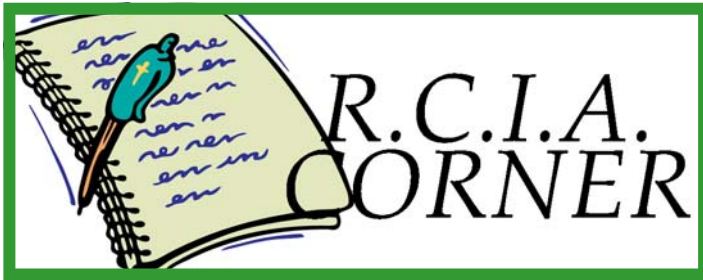
LENTEN MISSION...POSSIBLE

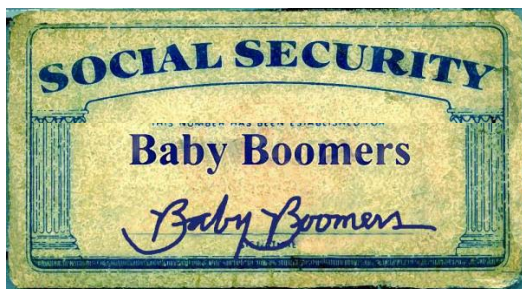


THIRD SUNDAY

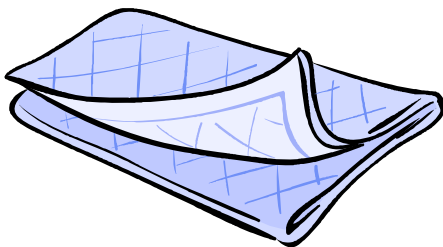

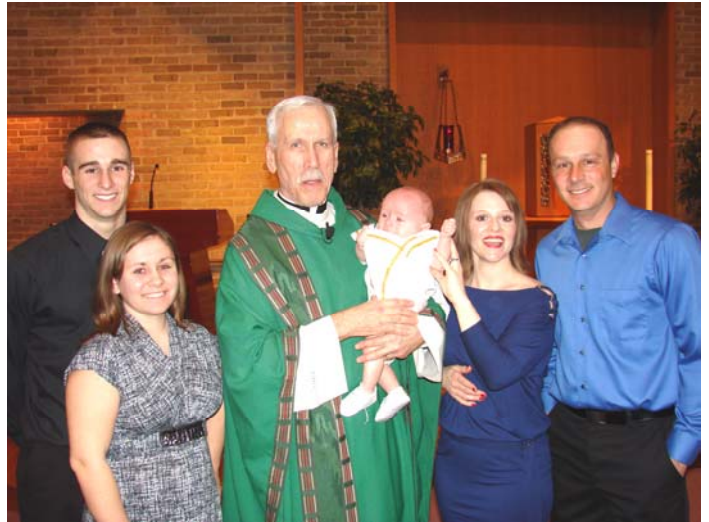

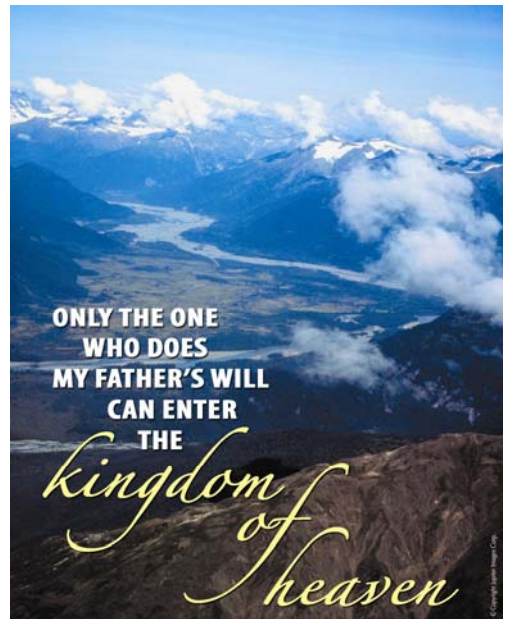

Ash Wednesday – March 9

Distribution of Ashes

7:00 a.m. - Mass

6:30 p.m. - Mass



1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
2. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
3. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.
5. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year. All of the faithful are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial (in addition to following the Lenten regulations), serious prayer, and a performance of works of charity and mercy.

1. Toda persona de 14 años de edad o más se obliga a abstenerse de comer carne el Miércoles de Ceniza y todos los viernes de Cuaresma.
2. Toda persona de 18 años de edad y menores de 59 años de edad está obligado a ayunar el Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo.
3. En estos dos días de ayuno y abstinencia, sólo una comida completa sin carne es permitida. Las otras dos comidas sin carne, suficiente para mantener la fuerza, se pueden tomar de acuerdo a las necesidades de cada uno, pero juntas no deben igualar otra comida completa. Comer entre comidas no es permitido en estos dos días, pero líquidos, incluyendo leche y jugos de fruta son permitidos. Cuando la salud o la capacidad de trabajo se verían gravemente afectados, la ley no obliga.
4. Para descartar completamente la ley del ayuno y la abstinencia es un pecado serio.
5. Cuaresma es la temporada principal de la penitencia en el año cristiano. Todos los fieles se recomienda encarecidamente a desarrollar y seguir un programa de voluntarios de auto-negación (además de seguir las regulaciones de la Cuaresma), la oración seria, y una representación de las obras de caridad y misericordia.
