Reflections From the Pastor

*Holy, holy, holy Lord God of host
Heaven and earth are full of your glory...*

Isaiah 6.3

Blessed is He who comes...Hosanna...

Psalm 118

Shortly we will experience changes in the word of prayers used at Mass. While most of the changes will occur in the prayers offered by the priest, there will also be some changes in the prayers of the assembly, e.g. in the *Profession of Faith*. At first glance, one might ask *why?* Is there really a need to make changes and, if so, why?

First, one needs to remember that the foundational text for the Mass of the Roman Rite is the *Latin text*. All translations into the vernacular, English, Spanish, German, etc., begin with the official Latin text.

Secondly, recognizing the Scriptural roots of the Liturgy, there is a desire to be faithful in the translation to the Scriptural origin of the prayer. For example, the structure of the Catholic Mass – the *Liturgy of the Word* and the *Liturgy of the Eucharist* – find their origin in the worship of the Old Testament. The Liturgy of the Word goes back to the *synagogue* while the Liturgy of the Eucharist is centered in the worship at the *Temple*. Much of the language of the Church's liturgical prayer derives from the language of both the synagogue and temple worship of Israel.

One good example is the *Holy, holy, holy* that serves as the transition from the *preface* into the *Eucharistic prayer*. The *Sanctus* or *Holy, Holy* comes from the Temple, the worship of the seraphim before the *Holy of Holies*, the Ark of the Covenant. One finds the song and the description of the song in the Temple worship in the prophet Isaiah (6) who was a priest of the Temple. The word *seraphim* in Hebrew means the *burning ones*, the ones who in their burning reflect their closeness to the radiance of God. The word *hosanna* that comes at the end of the seraphim song means *save us!*

The second part of the *Sanctus* – *Blessed is He...* comes from Psalm 118. One might recognize the words as those chanted by the crowds on Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem (Palm Sunday). Psalm 118 in Jewish liturgy is known as a *pilgrimage song*, sung by pilgrims processing to the temple. Once again the *Benedictus* or *Blessed is He* concludes with the plea of *hosanna* or *save us!*

I would invite us to take time this week to pray with the text of *Isaiah 6* and *Psalm 118* to appreciate more deeply the context of the *Sanctus* and *Benedictus* of the Mass and then to consider how this song helps us to enter more deeply into what is celebrated at Eucharist.

Personally, as I study more closely the biblical roots of our liturgy, I am coming to a deeper appreciation of the prayers and the need to be more faithful to the biblical language of the text. It is unfortunate that there has been some grumbling about the new translation and the need for it (I must confess that initially I did my share of grumbling!), but slowly I have come to realize this can be and is a marvelous opportunity to prayerfully reflect on the language of our liturgical prayer and how that biblical language and imagery serves to bring us to a deeper reverence for what is celebrated at Eucharist.

Santo, Santo, Santo Señor Dios de acogida

Bendito el que viene ... ¡Hosanna ...

Salmo 118

Poco vamos a experimentar cambios en la palabra de las oraciones utilizadas en la Misa Mientras que la mayoría de los cambios que se producirán en las oraciones ofrecidas por el sacerdote, también habrá algunos cambios en las oraciones de la asamblea, por ejemplo, en la profesión de la fe. A primera vista, uno podría preguntarse ¿por qué? ¿Existe realmente una necesidad de hacer cambios y, en caso afirmativo, ¿por qué?

En primer lugar, hay que recordar que el texto fundacional de la Misa del rito romano es el texto latino. Todas las traducciones a la lengua vernácula, Inglés, español, alemán, etc, comience con el texto oficial en latín.

En segundo lugar, el reconocimiento de las raíces bíblicas de la liturgia, hay un deseo de ser fiel en la traducción al origen bíblico de la oración. Por ejemplo, la estructura de la misa católica - la Liturgia de la Palabra y la Liturgia de la Eucaristía - tienen su origen en el culto del Antiguo Testamento. La Liturgia de la Palabra se remonta a la sinagoga, mientras que la Liturgia de la Eucaristía está centrada en el culto en el Templo. Gran parte de la lengua de la oración litúrgica de la Iglesia deriva de la lengua tanto de la adoración en la sinagoga y el templo de Israel.

Un buen ejemplo es el Santo, santo, santo, que sirve de transición desde el prólogo en la oración eucarística. El Sanctus o Santo, Santo, que vendrá desde el Templo, la adoración de los serafines antes de que el Santo de los Santos, el Arca de la Alianza. Se encuentra la canción y la descripción de la canción en el culto del Templo en el profeta Isaías (6), que era un sacerdote del templo. Los serafines palabra en hebreo significa los quema, los que en su ardor reflejar su cercanía con el resplandor de Dios. El hosanna palabra que sale al final de la canción de los serafines modos salve a nosotros!

La segunda parte del Sanctus - ¡Bendito sea ... viene del Salmo 118. Uno puede reconocer las palabras como los cantados por la multitud a la entrada triunfal de Jesús en Jerusalén (Domingo de Ramos). Salmo 118 en la liturgia judía se conoce como una canción de peregrinación, cantado por los peregrinos de proceso para el templo. Una vez más el Benedictus o Bendito sea Él concluye con la excepción de hosanna o nos salve!

Yo nos invito a tomar tiempo esta semana para orar con el texto de Isaías 6 y el Salmo 118 a apreciar más a fondo el contexto del Sanctus y el Benedictus de la misa y luego a considerar cómo esta canción nos ayuda a entrar más profundamente en lo que se celebrado en la Eucaristía.

Personalmente, al estudiar más de cerca las raíces bíblicas de nuestra liturgia, yo voy a una apreciación más profunda de las oraciones y la necesidad de ser más fiel al lenguaje bíblico del texto. Es lamentable que se ha producido algunas quejas acerca de la nueva traducción y la necesidad de que (debo confesar que al principio hice mi parte de quejas!), Pero poco a poco me he dado cuenta de esto puede ser y es una oportunidad maravillosa de oración reflexionar sobre el lenguaje de la oración litúrgica y la forma en que el lenguaje bíblico y las imágenes sirve para llevarnos a una reverencia más profunda de lo que se celebra en la Eucaristía.

Speaker next weekend

THE COMPASSION OF JESUS IN KENYA, AFRICA

In Jesus' time, lepers were shunned, considered unclean, and all physical contact with them was avoided for fear of contamination. Yet Jesus embraced them! Today's "lepers" are the victims of HIV/AIDS who are, to a great extent, shunned and avoided.

In Sub-Saharan Africa nearly 11,500 people die every day from HIV/AIDS. Two-thirds of the population (22.4 million people) in Sub-Saharan Africa is infected with AIDS. For every 55 people who die of AIDS, 74 more become infected. The disease threatens to wipe out entire generation during its most productive years. 14.1 million Africans have lost one or both parents to AIDS. Nearly one child in five is an orphan.

Having witnessed all the suffering caused by the disease, Sister Florence Muia, of the Assumption Sisters of Nairobi, decided she must get involved in the fight against HIV and AIDS. In 2002 she founded a clinic in Kenya and named it Upendo Village (Upendo means "love" in the Kiswahili language). The clinic focuses on compassionate care for HIV/AIDS patients and their families, providing basic health care and nutritional supplements, counseling, voluntary HIV and AIDS testing, and various social services.

The need for these services is great: approximately 4,000 clients a month, (an increase of 41% from the same period a year ago) are served by Upendo Village. Maintaining it is both physically taxing and financially difficult.

Sister Florence will speak at all the Masses on June 4th and 5th, seeking not only our prayers, but also as much financial assistance as we can provide. This will be our opportunity to embrace the families who rely on Upendo Village, and to let the compassion of Jesus work through us.

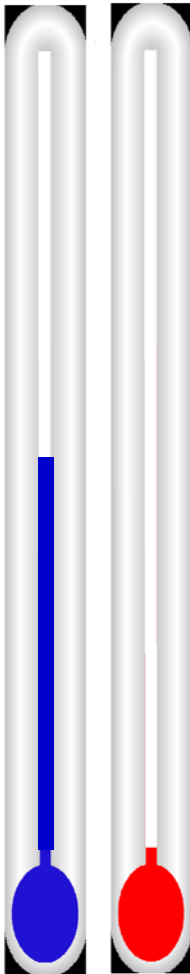

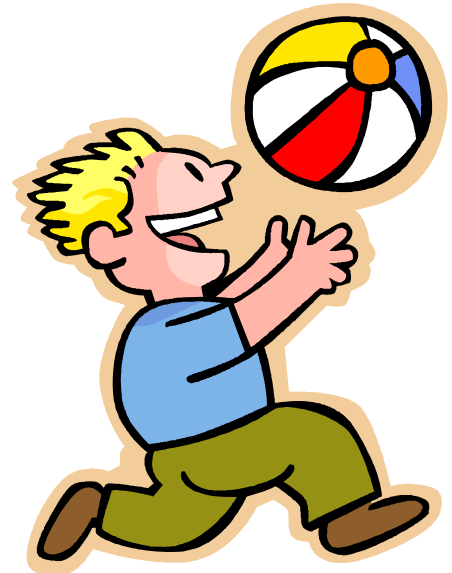
