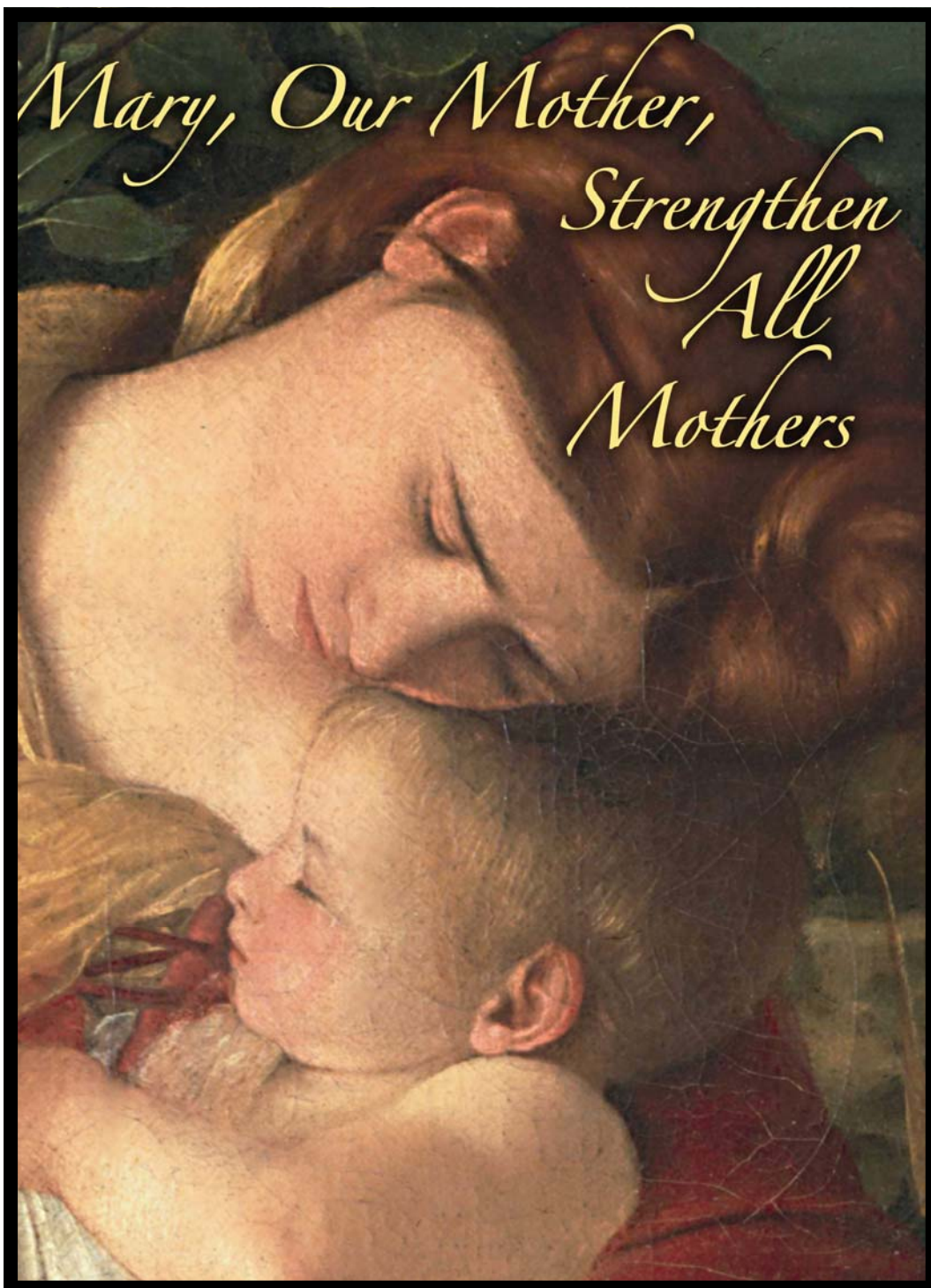

Reflections From the Pastor

*“He took the bread, broke the bread,
giving thanks.”*

One of my favorite post-resurrection stories in the gospels is the encounter of Jesus with the two disciples on the road to Emmaus. It is a curious thing that in all the stories of encounters with Jesus after the resurrection, one finds a reaction of both surprise and fear on the part of the disciples – a reaction that bespeaks their lack of faith. Also worth noting is the role of food in many of these stories. No accident as we shall see.

Looking at the story of Emmaus and several others, one might also note Jesus’ wonderful sense of humor, if I might say, devilish humor. Whether appearing as the gardener to Mary Magdalene when she visits the tomb or asking the disciples returning to Emmaus why they are so sad, Jesus almost seems to toy with them, using humor as a way of revealing Himself to His disciples.

During the fifty days of Easter as the Church reflects through Scriptures on who and what we are called to be as the baptized, attention is focused on the Eucharist. The fathers of Vatican II teach us that it is in the celebration of Eucharist that we are truly “Church” - *ekklesia* or *qahal* – the *people of God*. For this reason, the Church states clearly that everything we do as Church must either flow *to* or *from* the *Table of the Lord*.

It is worth noting that when the Church speaks of this *table* or altar, the Church speaks of it as being Christ Himself. For it is on that Table that Christ offers Himself to the Father, the sacrifice by which we are redeemed. It is because of this that the Bishop consecrates the altar with the oil of Chrism. Each time the priest approaches the Table for Eucharist he bows and kisses the altar. In other words, this Table is no ordinary table, nor is the meal celebrated at the Table just any meal.

A word frequently used in the N. T., especially the Gospel of Matthew, for church is *oikos*. The first place of gathering (*ekklesia*) for Eucharist was the *home*. And so the Scriptures speak of the *House-Church* or the *oikos*. And it was at the Table of the *oikos* where the *qahal* or community of the baptized gathered for Eucharist.

St. Paul, in his first letter to the church at Corinth, addressing abuses taking place at the Eucharist, gives us a wonderful window into seeing both how Eucharist was celebrated and understood by the community. He speaks of the *Blessing Cup* that is offered and shared as a sign of our fellowship in the Lord. He chides the wealthy for taking the better places at the Table and shunning the poor. He also chastises the community for not having an attitude of reverence and honor for the Eucharist celebrated at the Table.

The thoughts of Paul regarding the Eucharist as a sign of oneness in Christ is later echoed in the *priestly prayer* of Jesus at the Last Supper in which Jesus reflecting on His relationship to the Father prays that we, His disciples, might experience that same oneness with one another as we gather at Eucharist (*Gospel of John*).

St. John further underscores the meaning of this oneness in and with the Lord in the gesture of foot washing by Jesus – an extremely radical gesture. It is clear that this oneness experienced in Eucharist is lived out in service (*diakonia*), but service to the very least of our brothers and sisters (see the description by Jesus of the Final Judgement in *Matthew 25*).

“Tomó el pan, el pan,
dando gracias. ”

Una de mis historias favoritas después de la resurrección en los evangelios es el encuentro de Jesús con los dos discípulos en el camino de Emaús. Es curioso que en todas las historias de encuentros con Jesús después de la resurrección, se encuentra una reacción de sorpresa y temor por parte de los discípulos - una reacción que revela su falta de fe. También vale la pena destacar el papel de la alimentación en muchas de estas historias. No es casual, como veremos.

En cuanto a la historia de Emaús y varios otros, también se podría observar maravilloso sentido de Jesús del humor, si se me permite decir, diabólico humor. Ya sea que aparece como el jardinero a María Magdalena cuando visita la tumba o pidiendo a los discípulos de Emaús regresan por qué son tan tristes, Jesús casi parece jugar con ellos, utilizando el humor como una forma de revelarse a Sí mismo a sus discípulos.

Durante los cincuenta días de Pascua en la Iglesia refleja a través de las Escrituras sobre quién y qué estamos llamados a ser bautizados como la atención, se centra en la Eucaristía. Los padres del Concilio Vaticano II nos enseña que es en la celebración de la Eucaristía que estamos verdaderamente "Iglesia" - ekklesia o qahal - el pueblo de Dios. Por esta razón, la Iglesia declara con claridad que todo lo que hacemos como Iglesia o debe fluir hacia o desde la mesa del Señor.

Vale la pena señalar que cuando la Iglesia habla de esta mesa o altar, la Iglesia habla de ella como el mismo Cristo. Para ello está en que el cuadro que Cristo se ofrece al Padre el sacrificio por el cual somos redimidos. Es por esto que el obispo consagra el altar con el aceite del Crisma. Cada vez que el sacerdote se acerca a la Mesa de la Eucaristía se inclina y besa el altar. En otras palabras, este cuadro no es de mesa común, ni es la cena que tuvo lugar en la mesa es cualquier comida.

Una palabra de uso frecuente en el Nuevo Testamento, especialmente el Evangelio de Mateo, para la iglesia es oikos. El primer lugar de la reunión (ekklesia) para la Eucaristía era el hogar. Y así, las Escrituras hablan de la Casa-Iglesia o el oikos. Y fue en la Mesa del oikos donde el qahal o de la comunidad de los bautizados se reunieron para la Eucaristía.

St. Paul, en su primera carta a la iglesia de Corinto, frente a los abusos que tienen lugar en la Eucaristía, nos da una ventana maravillosa a ver tanto la manera en la Eucaristía fue celebrada y comprendida por la comunidad. Habla de la Copa de Bendición que se ofrece y se comparte como un signo de nuestra comunión en el Señor. Él reprende a los ricos para tomar los mejores lugares en la mesa y el rechazo a los pobres. También castiga la comunidad por no tener una actitud de reverencia y el honor de la Eucaristía celebrada en la Mesa.

Los pensamientos de Pablo sobre la Eucaristía como signo de unidad en Cristo es más eco en la oración sacerdotal de Jesús en la Última Cena en la que Jesús reflexionar sobre su relación con el Padre reza para que nosotros, sus discípulos, que podría experimentar la unidad con la misma unos a otros como nos reunimos en la Eucaristía (Evangelio de Juan).

San Juan subraya aún más el significado de esta unidad en y con el Señor en el gesto de lavar los pies de Jesús - un gesto muy radical. Está claro que esta unidad con experiencia en la Eucaristía se vive en el servicio (diakonia), pero el servicio a menos de nuestros hermanos y hermanas (ver la descripción de Jesús de la Sentencia Final en Mateo 25).

THE GRACE OF RECOGNITION. . .

*“I do not at all understand the
mystery of grace.*

*I only know that it meets us
where we are, but does not leave us where

Today’s Gospel story is a familiar story, a story of grace. It is the story of two of Jesus’ disciples who were struggling with loss – loss of Jesus and their loss of hope. Then along came a stranger who walked with them and talked with them on their journey to Emmaus. In the sharing of a meal with this stranger, they recognized that indeed it was Christ with them. Jesus met them where they were, but did not leave them where He had found them – Grace abundant!

As a child I remember the sisters reminding all of us, their students that we were to become other Christs in our world. What that meant to me back then – not so much. But the words, “other Christs” has stuck with me. And though, I am sure that I have missed many “sightings” of Christ in my life through the years, I know that there have been times when I recognized Christ through those “other Christs.”

Several memories come to mind. One was at a retreat many years ago that I had attended. By the end of the three days, I found myself rather bored and anxious to return home. At one of the final talks, the presenter (who became one of our priest friends) looked up at the cross and said, “What else does Jesus have to do to convince you that you are loved?” It was as if he were speaking just to me. That one statement changed my life. Indeed, I had encountered Christ.

One more memory: It was at Genesis House, (a home for prostitutes who were changing their lives) at a Baptism of a child who was to be adopted. I was told that one of the women present had taken on the responsibility of taking care of two children of a woman, a friend, who hoped to get “off the street”. After the ceremony, I approached

her and told her that she was admirable for taking on their care. She responded: “But that’s what people do for one another”. One more other Christ in our world.

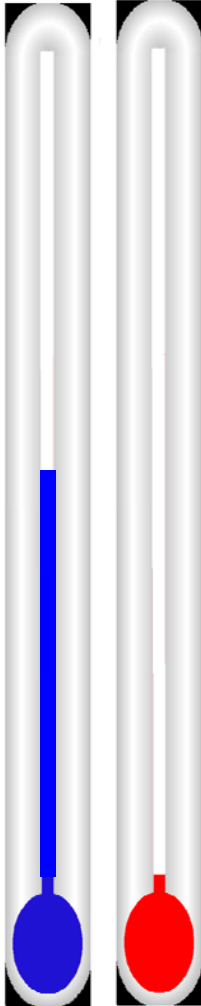

Downers Grove's own 6-yr-old Noah VanHoutan and his 5-yr-old sister, Laine are suffering from LINCL-Batten disease, an incurable genetic disorder. While both started life as "regular" kids, they are now experiencing seizures and mental impairment, and will become blind, tube fed and bed-ridden, and unable to communicate. At this time the disease is always fatal, typically between ages 8-12. By raising monies for Noah's Hope Fund our goal is to speed the research needed to discover a cure to help Noah and Laine, and other children like them.

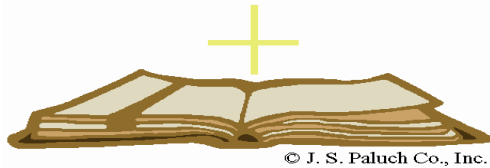
