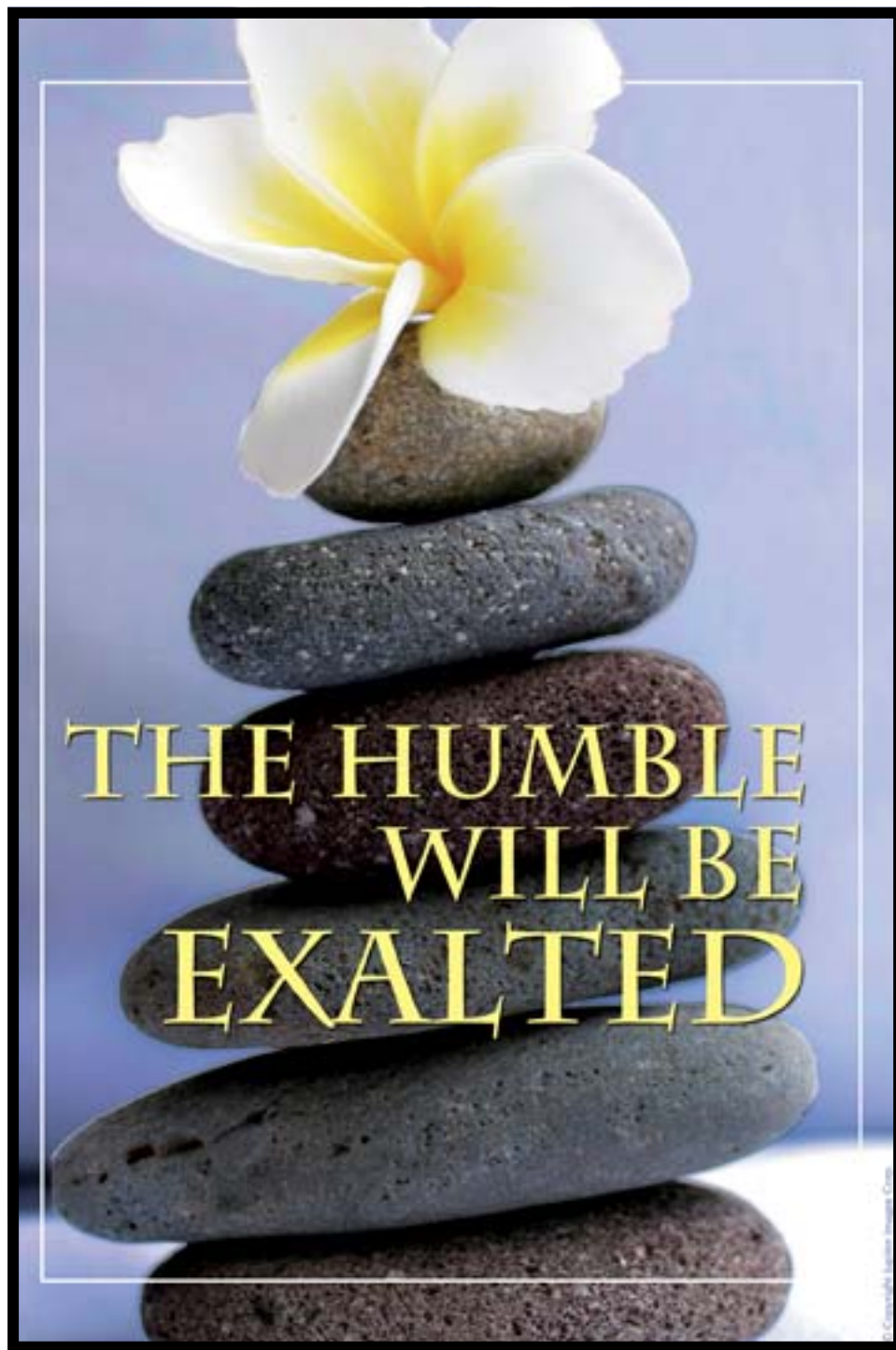

Reflections From the Pastor

I would like to take this opportunity to express my sincere thanks to everyone who worked so hard to make this year's MaryFest a memorable event. I think everyone who participated enjoyed everything, and I still cannot believe the amount of food and the amount of people we had to eat the food. So I thank everybody who prepared the food and I thank those who ate the food.

For me the centerpiece, of course, was the celebration of the Eucharist and the opportunity to do this as a community truly united in Christ. Also the opportunity to recognize the rich diversity of this parish community. I think it's important for us to have these moments to gather at the table of the Lord as one people.

In fact it brought back memories of when I was on sabbatical in Rome and participating in several papal masses in the Piazza of St. Peter's. In those celebrations as many as 200,000 people gathered. It really didn't matter whether it was raining, or cloudy or cold or sunny. It was just the opportunity for all of us to gather with the Holy Father to give thanks to the Lord God. And indeed it truly was a celebration of a church diverse in cultures and races and nationalities, but one in Christ.

Once again I want to thank everybody who worked so hard, whether it was preparing the food, the music, the entertainment, setting up or taking down. Good job done by all!!

I also want to take this opportunity to talk about our need to address issues with the infrastructure of the Divine Savior Parish plant. Members of the Buildings and Grounds Committee have spent several months doing a rather thorough analysis of all the buildings and properties of the parish, and of issues that need to be addressed, both for maintaining and improving the parish facilities. This Sunday someone from that Committee is speaking at the Masses to inform and to ask parishioners to help financially in addressing the various issues that have surfaced regarding the parish infrastructure.

As you know, Father Spiess, during his time as Parish Administrator, introduced the blue envelopes. The intent of that envelope is to raise money to provide for the capital improvements in the infrastructure of the parish. Many parishes have such an envelope referred to as a Development Fund. Since the introduction of the blue envelope, the parish has received, thanks to your generosity, monies that have enabled us to respond to capital needs. I encourage everyone to make use of the envelope as a way of ensuring that we will be able to maintain our buildings and provide for necessary upgrades in facilities.

As I reflected on today's Gospel parable in which Jesus instructs that "When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not recline at table in the place of honor", I was reminded of a wedding reception my husband and I attended a number of years ago. The mother of the bride was, and is, clearly a disciple. She is a person who lives out in her everyday -- "What would Jesus do?"

Usually when one arrives at a reception, there is a table designation and often the table is with friends, neighbors, family, etc. However when we arrived at this reception site for this particular wedding, no such luck -- no table cards! We were to simply find seats with the crowd. Unexpected, somewhat uncomfortable, we found a table with two available seats with people we had never met before. And, we had a great time!

Long ago, I used to have some wall hangings, banners, in our home. There was one that I particularly liked and remember. It had an image of Eucharistic hosts, and below was written:

"GO MY SONS AND DAUGHTERS AND MIX WITH THE CROWD"

Though it is not always the comfortable or most convenient path, it is what Jesus calls us to do each and every time we take in Jesus through communion, i.e. "Go and mix with the crowd".

Bernard Cooke, a scripture scholar and theologian, said that if each and every person who received Eucharist understood what it meant (that is, that we were to be Christ in our world), the world would be a very different place. . .

P.A.D.S. SIGN-UP

Public Action to Deliver Shelter (P.A.D.S.) is a collaborative ministry that involves non-profit organizations and churches in an effort to provide shelter and assistance of other needs to the homeless. At the local parish level, this ministry usually consists of one or more of the following efforts:

- Providing a site facility for overnight shelter.
- Providing dinner for each of the homeless guests.
- Providing bedding for overnight rest.
- Providing laundry services for the guests.
- Providing shower facilities for the guests.
- Providing a hot breakfast for the guests.
- Providing a carry-out bagged lunch for the guests.
- Optional provision of extra clothing and sundries.
- Optional provision of transportation vouchers.
- Optional provision of seasonal flu shots.

These are provided through the volunteer efforts of many churches and parishioners throughout DuPage County. At Divine Savior this support is provided by a team of volunteers that perform the following functions each of six Friday night/Saturday morning sessions:

- Meal planning, shopping, dinner preparation at the Parish Center and dinner transportation to the P.A.D.S. site located at St. Mary of Gostyn Parish, Downers Grove.
- Set-up of the sleeping and dining areas at the site.
- Admitting and registration of the guests.

- Serving the prepared dinner to the guests.
- Providing host services including guest laundry services.
- Monitoring the site after doors have been secured.
- Preparing the next day lunches.
- Preparing and serving the morning breakfasts.
- Clean-up of the facilities in the morning.
- Laundry of the linens, sheets & pillow cases for the next week's session.

This coming year, there will be a total of eight teams supporting this collaborative effort of St. Mary's and Divine Savior parishes enabling the site to remain open for eleven months. Sign ups of new volunteers for this important ministry will be held on September 4-5 and September 11-12 in the church Narthex.

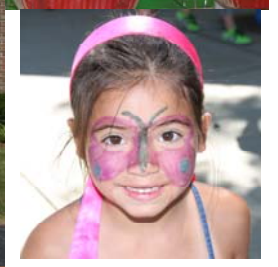

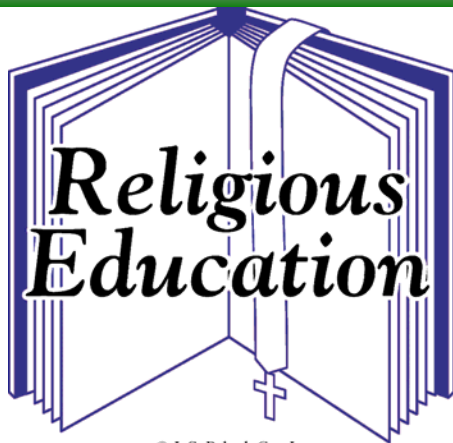

Updates from our Pastor



Below is a follow-up to my recent bulletin article regarding our parish's capital projects plan. A representative from the Buildings & Grounds Committee will be in the Narthex after all Masses to answer any questions.

Divine Savior Parish Capital Projects Plan - Explained

After almost 40 years, the buildings of Divine Savior need some major work. This work should begin immediately and be completed as noted in the August 1st church bulletin in the next two years. The following is a brief description of the work to be accomplished:

Church roof – To continue a flat roof warranty, some repairs are necessary to correct roof and flashing separation problems.

Church Rain Gutters/Scuppers – To correct water infiltration to the South church wall, new scupper designs are needed and new gutters installed. You may have noticed a white discoloration on the brick at the ceiling as you leave church through the west doors. This is water damage caused by a leaky roof and design problems with the scuppers (the place where the exterior roof and walls meet). Also gutter straps and gutter caulking of all gutters are needed immediately.

Church Brick Repairs – Over the years the mortar holding some of the bricks has eroded. This mortar needs repairs and the entire church needs a water repellent applied. Most of this damage is at the upper elevations of the building. Pictures will be available for review.

Church Heating/Cooling – With changes to church room usages over the years (sacristy moved, pastor's office and church offices moved, etc.) no work was done to the heating and cooling systems. That work should be done now to make the energy used for these spaces more cost effective.

Pastoral Center – This free standing building needs brick repairs and brick treatment to reduce water infiltration.

Rectory – The heating and air-conditioning systems in the rectory are originals and need replacing. The 19 year old hot water heater should also be replaced. In addition, work is needed to improve insulation and to repair the sidewalk on the East side of the building.

To further illustrate the immediate need for these repairs, the committee has taken numerous photos. Some of these pictures can be viewed in the church narthex. Members of the committee will be available to answer any questions on these repairs.

To accomplish these repairs that should be completed in 2010, it will cost the parish \$48,600 above the normal operating budget.

Please help with these capital projects to keep Divine Savior Parish cool and dry for the foreseeable future. The money raised through the use of the [blue envelopes](#) will be most important over the next few months.

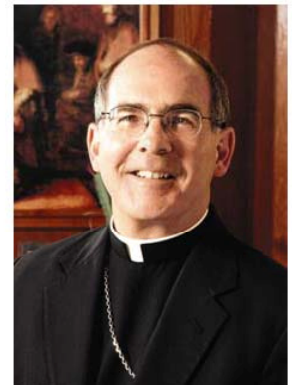

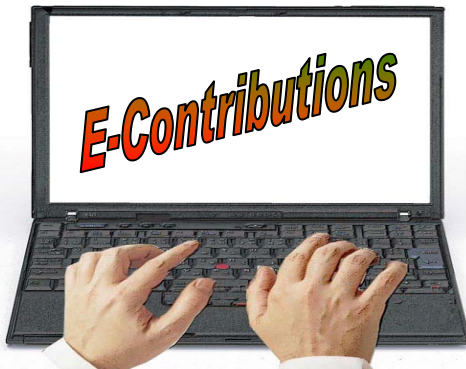

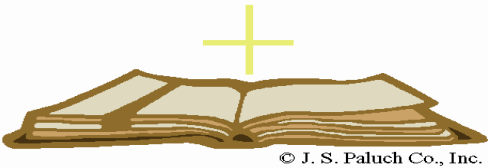
