The Greek word *evangelion* translates into English as *gospel*. It comes from two Greek words meaning *good news*. The Second Vatican Council awakened a new and exciting understanding of Church based on the word *evangelion*. As Blessed John XXIII stated so well in convoking the Council this was not to be a Council that condemns but rather works to present the faith in a way that will speak *good news* to the modern world. As Church, we are called to be an evangelizing people.

The idea of evangelization was so important that the first *synod* of bishops convoked by Pope Paul VI was to concern itself with the call to evangelization. Most importantly what does it mean to speak of an *evangelizing church*? And who is responsible for the work of evangelization? An evangelizing Church must be a community of persons thoroughly convinced that the Word of God is truly *Good News*. Unless we Catholics are convinced of this, we cannot possibly hope to be this evangelizing Church. Pope Paul VI in his apostolic exhortation, *Evangelization in the Modern World*, speaks directly to this point in saying that the work of evangelization must begin with the evangelizer. In other words, the gospel calls us to a continual conversion or change of heart (*metanoia*). Jesus in the *Gospel of Mark* (1:15) announces “*the kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel*”.

In thinking about evangelization to me it is clear that the first task at hand must be coming to know the Scriptures as the Word of God through study and prayer. The importance of this task of knowing Scriptures is underscored by the publishing of the *Lectionary* shortly after the synod. The *Lectionary* consists of a 3 year cycle of readings from the *Hebrew Scriptures* (Old Testament), the pastoral letters and gospels of the New Testament. The reformed liturgy of Paul VI that came from the Second Vatican Council provides us with a virtual banquet in the Word of God, unlike the Tridentine Mass.

With the new *Lectionary* came a serious reflection on Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. For the first time in the history of the Church there is a *rite of baptism for infants*. For almost 2000 years the Church had used the rite for the baptism of adults. This fact made evident that the norm for baptism is the reception of adults, not children, through the waters of baptism. Baptizing of infants was permitted in the case of parents practicing and living their faith. Note that Jesus states first proclaim the Good News and then baptize those who embrace the Good News. Baptism, as all sacraments, is a response to hearing God’s Word.

If I were asked what is the crown jewel of the Second Vatican Council, without hesitation I would say it was the *restoration* of the *Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults*. The first document promulgated at the Second Vatican Council *Sacrosanctum Concilium* (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy) called for the restoration and renewal of all the rites of the Church. The last became the *Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults*. In many ways, not until this rite came about could one fully appreciate the other liturgical reforms.

The *RCIA* structures and celebrates the journey of faith that is the life of an evangelizing Church. Vatican II imaged the Church as *Pilgrim*. We are a *Pilgrim Church*. And the *RCIA* is very much about pilgrims on a journey to a holy place who invite others along the way to join their pilgrimage to God. And on this journey the pilgrims stop, invite and welcome others (rites) to walk with them. And just as in Chaucer’s *Canterbury Tales* the pilgrims share stories along the way (the Word of God, the *Good News*).

Over the next several weeks we will be asking you as pilgrims to stop, to invite and to welcome others – neighbors, friends, family members – to join us on our pilgrimage to the house of God. You might be surprised to know that there are many out there who are just waiting to be invited to join us on the journey. To invite is just that! There are no strings attached. Folks are welcomed to walk with us whether for a mile or for the whole journey home. They also have the freedom to decline our invitation. But whatever they do does not lessen our call to reach out and to invite.

La palabra griega evangelion se traduce en Inglés como un evangelio. Proviene de dos palabras griegas que significan buenas noticias. El Concilio Vaticano II despertó una nueva y emocionante de la Iglesia basada en la palabra de evangelion. Como el beato Juan XXIII expresado muy bien, al convocar el Consejo no iba a ser un Consejo que condena, sino que trabaja para presentar la fe de una manera que se habla una buena noticia para el mundo moderno. Como Iglesia, estamos llamados a ser un pueblo evangelizadora.

La idea de la evangelización era tan importante que el primer sínodo de obispos convocado por el Papa Pablo VI fue a ocuparse de la llamada a la evangelización. Más importante aún, ¿qué significa hablar de una Iglesia evangelizadora? ¿Y quién es el responsable de la obra de evangelización? Una Iglesia evangelizadora debe ser una comunidad de personas completamente convencido de que la Palabra de Dios es una noticia realmente buena. A menos que nosotros, los católicos están convencidos de esto, no puede esperar a ser esta Iglesia evangelizadora. El Papa Pablo VI en su exhortación apostólica, la evangelización en el mundo moderno, se dirige directamente a este punto al decir que la obra de evangelización debe comenzar con el evangelizador. En otras palabras, el Evangelio nos llama a una conversión continua o el cambio de corazón (metanoia). Jesús en el Evangelio de Marcos (1:15) anuncia "el reino de Dios está cerca. Convertíos y creed en el Evangelio".

Al reflexionar sobre la evangelización para mí es claro que la primera tarea debe ser llegar a conocer las Escrituras como la Palabra de Dios a través del estudio y la oración. La importancia de esta tarea de conocer las Escrituras es subrayada por la publicación del Leccionario poco después del sínodo. El Leccionario se compone de un ciclo de tres años de lecturas de las Escrituras Hebreas (Antiguo Testamento), las cartas pastorales y los evangelios del Nuevo Testamento. La liturgia reformada de Pablo VI, que llegó desde el Concilio Vaticano II nos ofrece un banquete virtual en la Palabra de Dios, a diferencia de la Misa Tridentina

Con el nuevo Leccionario fue una reflexión seria sobre el Bautismo, la Confirmación y la Eucaristía. Por primera vez en la historia de la Iglesia no es un rito de bautismo para los niños. Por casi 2000 años la Iglesia ha utilizado el rito del bautismo de adultos. Este hecho hizo evidente que la norma para el bautismo es la recepción de los adultos, no niños, a través de las aguas del bautismo. Bautismo de los niños se le permitió en el caso de los padres de practicar y vivir su fe. Tenga en cuenta que Jesús declara primero proclamar la Buena Nueva y bautizar a los que abrazan la Buena Nueva. El bautismo, como todos los sacramentos, es una respuesta a escuchar la Palabra de Dios.

Si me preguntaran cuál es la joya de la corona del Concilio Vaticano II, sin dudarlo diría que fue la restauración del Rito de Iniciación Cristiana de Adultos. El primer documento promulgado por el Concilio Vaticano II Sacrosanctum Concilium (Constitución sobre la Sagrada Liturgia) llamó a la restauración y la renovación de todos los ritos de la Iglesia. El pasado se convirtió en el Rito de Iniciación Cristiana de Adultos. En muchos sentidos, no hasta que este rito se produjo podía apreciar plenamente las reformas litúrgicas.

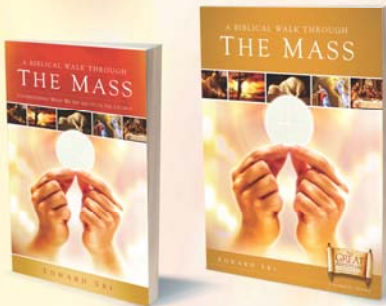

Tal vez te sorprenda saber que hay muchos por ahí que están a la espera de ser invitados a unirse a nosotros en el viaje. Invitar es justamente eso! No hay condiciones. La gente se dio la bienvenida a caminar con nosotros ya sea por un par de kilómetros para el viaje de vuelta entera. También tienen la libertad de rechazar nuestras invitación. Pero cualquier cosa que hagan, no disminuye nuestro llamado para llegar e invitar a.

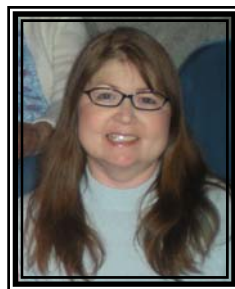

MaryFest—August 13, 2011

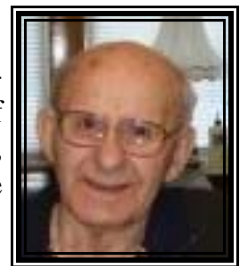

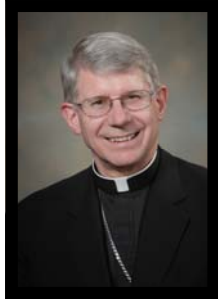


We would also like to express our deepest sympathy to the family of Eugene Wrobel, uncle of Sue (Bill) Hartig,

Please remember Deborah, Eugene, and Joan in your prayers and pray also that their families may receive the Lord's consolation in their time of need.

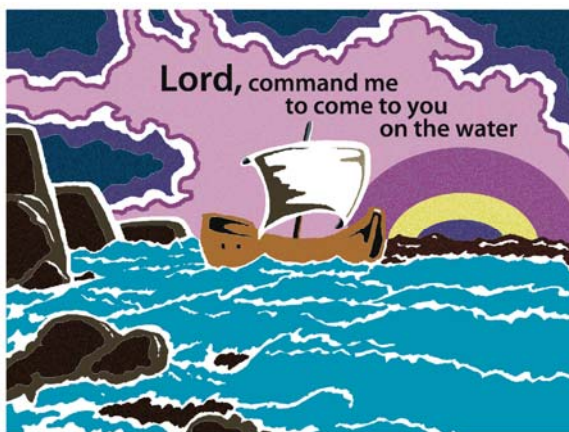


You're Invited

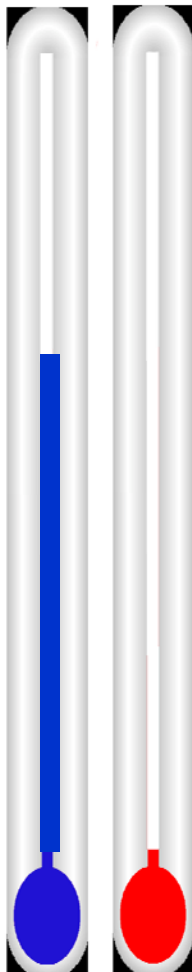

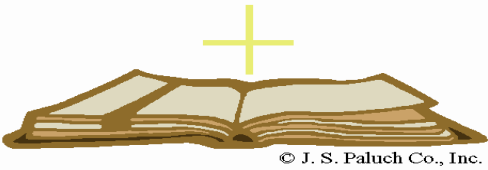
